For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR A GRANT FOR
EDUCATION, TRAINING AND OTHER RELATED EXPENSES FOR
EPILEPSY TRAINING AND SERVICES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF
HEALTH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2019; AND
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2018-2019 FISCAL
YEAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - EPILEPSY TRAINING AND SERVICES. There is
hereby appropriated, to the Department of Health, to be payable from cash
funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Department of Health, for a
grant for education, training and other related expenses for epilepsy
training and services of the Department of Health for the fiscal year ending
June 30, 2019, the following:

SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and



1 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
2 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
3 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
4 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
5 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
6 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

8 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
9 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
10 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
11 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
12 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
13 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
14 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
15 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

17 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
18 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of
19 the Department of Health are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient
20 for the Department of Health to continue to provide essential governmental
21 services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies
22 for the Department of Health to continue such services; and that a delay in
23 the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper
24 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
25 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
26 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in
27 full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

28 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall
29 become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the
30 Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the
31 veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house
32 overrides the veto.
