LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 9 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 10 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 11 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 12 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 13 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 14 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 15 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 16 17 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 18 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of 19 the Department of Health are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient 20 for the Department of Health to continue to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies 21 22 for the Department of Health to continue such services; and that a delay in 23 the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, 24 25 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in 26 27 full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall 28 29 become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the 30 Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house 31 32 overrides the veto. 33

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
