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2	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 56, Subchapter 3, is		
3	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
4	20-56-305. Prohibitions on manufacturing and processing medical		
5	<u>marijuana.</u>		
6	A cultivation facility, dispensary, or processor shall not process or		
7	manufacture a medical marijuana product for consumption that:		
8	(1) Is likely to appeal to minors by its shape or design,		
9	including without limitation:		
10	(A) Products that are modeled after noncannabis products		
11	primarily consumed by and marketed to children;		
12	(B) Products in the shape of an animal, vehicle, person,		
13	or character; and		
14	(C) Products that closely resemble familiar food and drink		
15	items that are attractive to minors, regardless of whether the familiar food		
16	and drink item is a generic or branded product, including without limitation		
17	candy, cookies, and brownies; and		
18	(2) Is made by applying cannabinoid concentrates or extracts to		
19	commercially available candy, food, or beverages.
