23	(a) The Arkansas State Hospital shall have the power to establish	
24	guidelines, rules, and regulations in the administration of this section.	
25	(b)(1) The Arkansas State Hospital through the Department of Human	
26	Services is authorized and empowered to assist community mental health	
27	centers and clinics in providing funds for medication required for the	
28	treatment of mental illness for medically indigent patients at a rate not to	)
29	exceed five cents (5¢) per capita of the geographical area served by those	
30	community mental health centers or clinics.	
31	(2) The most recent federal census will be used in determining	
32	the per capita of the area on which an allocation is made.	
33	(c)(1) Disbursement of funds authorized by this section shall be

1 201 et seq.; the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, § 19-4-101 2 et seq.; the Revenue Stabilization Law, § 19-5-101 et seq.; and other fiscal 3 control laws of the state, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 4 5 strictly complied with in disbursement of the funds. 6 (c)(l) A community mental health center shall be funded by a 7 combination of funds from the mental health block grants, social services 8 block grants, and state general revenue. 9 (2) For fiscal year 2020 and fiscal year 2021, funding for 10 community mental health centers shall not be less than the amount 11 appropriated for community mental health centers on July 1, 2018. 12 (3) The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services 13 of the Department of Human Services shall meet with community mental health 14 centers annually to determine appropriate increases in funding for each 15 fiscal year. 16 (4)(A) A community mental health center shall report quarterly 17 on the adequacy of funding for fiscal year 2020 and fiscal year 2021 to: 18 (i) The Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, 19 and Labor; and 20 (ii) The House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, 21 and Labor. 22 (B) The report shall include an annual audit of the 23 community mental health center that is performed by an independent certified public accountant and meets generally accepted accounting principles. 24 25 26 20-46-303. Standards generally. 27 In approving or rejecting community mental health clinics for the 28 purpose of mental health services, the Director of the Department of Human Services shall consider the following factors: 29 (1) Adequacy of mental health services provided by the clinic, 30 31 including mental health outpatient diagnostic and treatment services; 32 (2) Rehabilitative services for patients suffering from mental 33 or emotional disorders; (3) Collaborative and cooperative services with public health 34

8	health services in the State of Arkansas, specifically those behavioral
9	health services providing emergency screenings twenty-four (24) hours per
10	day, seven (7) days per week; and
11	(8) The full array of outpatient services for the community
12	provided, including psychiatry services.
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
