12	In approving or rejecting community mental health clinics for the		
13	purpose of mental health services, the Director of the Department of Human		
14	Services shall consider the following factors:		
15	(1) Adequacy of mental health services provided by the clinic,		
16	including mental health outpatient diagnostic and treatment services;		
17	(2) Rehabilitative services for patients suffering from mental		
18	or emotional disorders;		
19	(3) Collaborative and cooperative services with public health		
20	and other state, county, city, and private groups for programs of prevention		
21	and treatment of mental illness and other psychiatric, psychological, and		
22	social disabilities;		
23	(4) Consultative services to schools, to courts, and to health		
24	and welfare agencies, both public and private;		
25	(5) Informational and educational services to the general public		
26	and to lay and professional groups; and		
27	(6) Study and training activities in the field of mental health;		
28	(7) Demonstrated experience providing outpatient behavioral		
29	health services in the State of Arkansas, specifically those behavioral		
30	health services providing emergency screenings twenty-four (24) hours per		
31	day, seven (7) days per week; and		
32	(8) The full array of outpatient services for the community		
33	provided, including psychiatry services.
