27	SECTION 1. DO N	NOT CODIFY. <u>Legislative intent.</u>	
28	The General Asse	embly finds that:

16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 25-30-101(b), concerning the membership of
17	the Career Education and Workforce Development Board, is amended to read as
18	follows:
19	(b) The board shall consist of the following members, to be appointed
20	by the Governor with advice and consent of the Senate:
21	(1)(A) As voting members, from a list of recommendations by
22	industry and business associations:

24	industry;

35	(G)(vii) One (1) member to represent the financial

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2	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 25-30-102 is amended to read as follows:
3	25-30-102. Powers and duties of the Office of Skills Development and
4	the Career Education and Workforce Development Board.
5	(a) (l) The Office of Skills Development and the Career Education and
6	Workforce Development Board, in coordination with the Department of Higher
7	Education, the Higher Education Coordinating Board, and the Department of
8	Education, shall: develop and monitor a state plan for vocational-technical
9	education, which shall include at least the establishment of one (1) area
10	vocational center in each education service cooperative service area and in
11	Pulaski County.
12	(2) All policy issues affecting the public schools will be
13	developed by the Career Education and Workforce Development Board after
14	consultation with the State Board of Education and implemented in
15	coordination with the Department of Education or the education service
16	cooperatives, or both.
17	(b)(1) The Career Education and Workforce Development Board shall have
18	general supervision of all programs regarding vocational, technical, and
19	occupational education.
20	(2) All of those programs and the funding of those programs
21	shall be subject to the approval of the Career Education and Workforce
22	Development Board.
23	(c)(1) The responsibilities of the Career Education and Workforce
24	Development Board shall include all vocational, technical, and occupational
25	education, including without limitation the following:
26	(A)(1)(A) Establishing policies relating to plans and
27	specifications for facilities and instructional equipment Bring together
28	business leaders, industry leaders, education leaders, state agencies,
29	training providers, and other workforce development stakeholders in order to
30	develop a strategic plan and road map for meeting current and future
31	workforce demands.
32	(B) The plan required under subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this
33	section shall:
34	(i) Assist state agencies in better understanding
35	the changing economy;
36	(ii) Promote alignment of workforce education,

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1	nigher education, skills, and training with present and luture career
2	opportunities;
3	(iii) Identify the estimated costs associated with
4	implementing the required plan under this section;
5	(iv) Identify potential new revenue streams to fund
6	recommendations that are supplemental to existing education funding sources;
7	<u>and</u>
8	(v) Identify areas of high unemployment in the state
9	where increased efforts can stimulate job growth and employment attainment.
10	(C) A preliminary plan and recommendations shall be
11	presented to the Governor, the Senate Committee on Education, and the House
12	Committee on Education by July 2020;
13	(B)(2) Prescribing standardized standards for programs and
14	teachers Develop and oversee a comprehensive apprenticeship office that
15	serves as the center point for business, industry, and education leaders that
16	want to establish an earn-to-learn apprenticeship program;
17	(C)(3) Approving applied courses of related academic instruction
18	Design and create a website that exhibits all aspects of workforce
19	development education, programs, and employment opportunities in the state,
20	and includes without limitation information and opportunities for students,
21	educators, industry leaders, and employers; and
22	(4) Develop a catalogue of nationally recognized credentials
23	that are widely adopted by the respective industries and related to the
24	applicable programs of instruction at each high school, community college, or
25	technical institute or vocational-technical school;
26	(5)(A) Report on the status of programs of instruction related
27	to the catalogue of nationally recognized credentials developed under
28	subdivision (a)(4) of this section on an annual basis to the Senate Committee
29	on Education and the House Committee on Education beginning January 1, 2020.
30	(B) The report required under (a)(5)(A) of this section
31	shall include without limitation related costs associated with seeking and
32	maintaining identified national credentials;
33	(6) Establish an asset map to identify all state and federal
34	dollars and programs that are intended for workforce education and training
35	from kindergarten through career levels in order to promote alignment of all
36	resources utilized towards the development of an educated and skilled

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1	workforce in this state;	
2	(7) Establish an industry sector-led review of related industry	
3	specific programs that are delivered by two-year institutions of higher	
4	education and, if applicable, four-year institutions of higher education that	
5	includes without limitation:

12	Workforce Development Board for other programs as it deems appropriate.
13	(b) The office and the board shall be industry-driven in membership
14	and duties.

16	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
17	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas workforce education
18	operates within a variety of agencies without coordination, often with
19	significant inefficiencies arising from overlapping and repeated programming;
20	that this act will bring workforce education programs together under a single
21	umbrella agency and uniform access to information; and that this act is
22	immediately necessary because the effectiveness of this act is essential to
23	the operation of the programs for which appropriations will be provided.
24	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
25	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
26	become effective on:
27	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
28	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
29	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
30	bill; or
31	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
32	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
