| 10 | SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the |
| 11 | General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the deficiencies in Paul's |
| 12 | Law: To Prohibit Drivers From Using a Wireless Communications Device While |
| 13 | Operating a Motor Vehicle and Fewer Distractions Mean Safer Driving Act |
| 14 | disqualify the state from receiving a Comprehensive Distracted Driving Grant; |
| 15 | that this act allows the state to qualify for a Comprehensive Distracted |
| 16 | Driving Grant; that Arkansas law is required to be in compliance with federal |
| 17 | law by July 1, 2019 for the state to qualify for Comprehensive Distracted |
| 18 | Driving Grant funds distributed in 2020. Therefore, an emergency is declared |
| 19 | to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of |
| 20 | the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on: |
| 21 | (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; |
| 22 | (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, |
| 23 | the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the |
