7	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-23-130(d), concerning prohibition
8	against texting, is amended to read as follows:
9	(d) A person who is convicted of violating this section shall be:
10	(1) Guilty of commits a violation; and
11	(2) Fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).
12	
13	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 27-51-1503 is amended to read as follows:
14	27-51-1503. Definitions.
15	As used in this subchapter:
16	(1) "Access, read, or post to a social networking site" means
17	using a wireless telecommunications device to interact with a web-based
18	service that allows a person to:
19	(A) Construct a profile within a bounded system;
20	(B) Articulate a list of other members with whom the
21	person shares a connection; and
22	(C) Communicate with other members of the site;
23	(2)(A) "Operate a motor vehicle" or "operating a motor vehicle"
24	means operating a motor vehicle on a public road, street, or highway.
25	(B) "Operate a motor vehicle" or "operating a motor
26	vehicle" does not include driving or operating a motor vehicle that has
27	pulled over to the side of or off of a public road, street, or highway and
28	stopped by the driver in a location where the motor vehicle may safely remain
29	stationary;
30	(3) "Texting" means reading from or manually entering data into
31	a wireless telecommunications device, including doing so for the purpose of
32	SMS texting, emailing, instant messaging, or engaging in any other form of
33	electronic data retrieval or electronic data communication; and
34	(4)(A) "Wireless telecommunications device" means a cellular
35	telephone, a text-messaging device, a personal digital assistant, a stand-
36	alone computer, or a substantially similar wireless device that is readily

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1 removable from the vehicle and is used to write, send, or read text or data 2 through manual input. 3 "Wireless telecommunications device" does not include 4 **a**: 5 (i) Citizens band radio; 6 (ii) Citizens band radio hybrid; 7 (iii) Commercial two-way radio communication device; 8 (iv) Two-way radio transmitter or receiver used by a 9 licensee of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur Radio 10 Service: or 11 (v) Hands-free wireless telephone or 12 telecommunications device; and 13 (3) "Write, send, or read a text-based communication" means 14 using a wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with a 15 person by using a text-based communication commonly referred to as a text 16 message, instant message, or electronic mail. 17 18 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 27-51-1504 is amended to read as follows: 19 27-51-1504. Use of wireless telecommunications device when driving. 20 (a)(1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section, 21 a driver of a motor vehicle shall not operate a motor vehicle while using a 22 wireless telecommunications device to: 23 (A) Write, send, or read a text-based communication Engage 24 in texting; or 25 (B) Access, read, or post to a social networking site. 26 (2) A driver of a motor vehicle is not in violation of 27 subdivision (a)(1) of this section if he or she reads, selects, or enters a 28 telephone number or name in a wireless telecommunications device for the 29 purpose of making a telephone call. 30 (b) A person is exempt from the requirements of this section if he or 31 she is: 32 (1) Performing official duties as a certified law enforcement officer, firefighter, ambulance driver, or emergency medical technician; 33 34 Operating a motor vehicle while using a wireless 35 telecommunications device to: 36 (A) Report illegal activity;

1	(B) Summon medical or other emergency assistance; or
2	(C) Prevent injury to a person or property;
3	(D) Relay information between a transit or for-hire
4	operator dispatcher, if the wireless telecommunications device is permanently
5	affixed to the motor vehicle; or
6	(E) Navigate using a global positioning system; or
7	(3) A physician or healthcare provider using a wireless
8	telecommunications device <u>for emergency medical purposes</u> to communicate with
9	a hospital, health clinic, or the office of the physician, or to provide for
10	the health care or medical emergency of a person.
11	
12	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 27-51-1505 is amended to read as follows:
13	27-51-1505. Preemption.
14	This subchapter supersedes and preempts all county or municipal
15	ordinances regarding the use of a handheld wireless telephone <u>wireless</u>
16	telecommunication device for wireless interactive communication texting while
17	operating a motor vehicle.
18	
19	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 27-51-1506(a), concerning penalties under
20	"Paul's Law: To Prohibit Drivers From Using a Wireless Communications Device
21	While Operating a Motor Vehicle", is amended to read as follows:
22	(a)(1) A violation of this subchapter is punishable by a fine of not
23	<u>less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor</u> more than two hundred fifty
24	dollars (\$250) for the first offense.
25	(2) Each subsequent violation of this subchapter is punishable
26	by a fine of not <u>less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor</u> more than five hundred
27	dollars (\$500).
28	
29	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code §§ 27-51-1602-27-51-1609 are amended to read
30	as follows:
31	27-51-1602. Definitions.
32	As used in this subchapter:
33	(1) "Emergency purpose" means the reason for contacting any of
34	the following to report an emergency:
35	(A) Law enforcement personnel;
36	(B) Fire department personnel;

1	(C) Public safety personnel;
2	(D) Emergency medical personnel; or
3	(E) A 911 public safety communications center;
4	(2)(A) "Handheld wireless telephone" means a wireless
5	interactive communication device with which a user engages in wireless
6	interactive communication using at least one (1) hand.
7	(B) "Handheld wireless telephone" does not include a:
8	(i) Hands-free wireless telephone or device;
9	(ii) Citizens band radio;
10	(iii) Citizens band radio hybrid; or
11	(iv) Global positioning or navigation device or
12	system;
13	(3)(A) "Hands-free wireless telephone or device" means a
14	wireless telephone or other wireless communication device that allows a user
15	to engage in wireless interactive communication without the use of either
16	hand with:
17	(i) An internal feature or function; or
18	(ii) An attachment or additional device.
19	(B) A hands-free wireless telephone or device may be a
20	permanent or temporary part of the wireless telephone or other wireless
21	communication device.
22	(C) A hands-free wireless telephone or device may require
23	the use of either hand to activate, deactivate, or initiate a function of the
24	wireless telephone or other communication device;
25	(4) "Highway work zone" means any area upon or adjacent to a
26	highway, road, or street of this state where construction, reconstruction,
27	maintenance, or any other type of work is being performed or is in progress;
28	(5) "Highway worker" means an employee of any of the following
29	who is present in a highway work zone:
30	(A) The Arkansas Department of Transportation;
31	(B) A county;
32	(C) A municipality; or
33	(D) A contractor or subcontractor of the State Highway
34	Commission or a county or municipality that is performing duties related to
35	the highway work zone;
36	(6) "Wireless interactive communication" means talking, typing,

1	emailing, or accessing information on the internet with a wireless telephone;
2	and
3	(7)(A) "Wireless telephone" means a wireless interactive
4	communication device.
5	(B) "Wireless telephone" includes a handheld wireless
6	telephone and a hands-free wireless telephone or device.
7	
8	27-51-1603. Restrictions on drivers under 18 years of age.
9	(a) Except as provided under subsection (b) of this section, a driver
10	of a motor vehicle who is under eighteen (18) years of age shall not use a
11	wireless telephone for wireless interactive communication while operating a
12	motor vehicle.
13	(b) A driver of a motor vehicle who is under eighteen (18) years of
14	age may use a wireless telephone for wireless interactive communication while
15	operating a motor vehicle for an emergency purpose only.
16	
17	27-51-1604. Restrictions on drivers at least 18 but under 21 years of
18	age.
19	(a)(1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the driver of a
20	motor vehicle who is at least eighteen (18) but under twenty-one (21) years
21	of age shall not use a handheld wireless telephone for wireless interactive
22	communication while operating a motor vehicle.
23	(2) The driver of a motor vehicle who is at least eighteen (18)
24	but under twenty-one (21) years of age may use a hands-free wireless
25	telephone or device for wireless interactive communication while operating a
26	motor vehicle.
27	(b) A driver of a motor vehicle who is at least eighteen (18) but
28	under twenty-one (21) years of age may use a handheld wireless telephone for
29	wireless interactive communication while operating a motor vehicle for an
30	emergency purpose only.
31	
32	27-51-1605. Enforcement.
33	A driver of a motor vehicle is not to be stopped or detained solely to
34	determine compliance with this subchapter.
35	
36	27-51-1606. Preemption.

I	This subchapter supersedes and preempts all county or municipal
2	ordinances regarding wireless telephone use by drivers of motor vehicles.
3	
4	27-51-1607. Penalties.
5	(a)(l) A violation of this subchapter is punishable by a fine of not
6	more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for the first offense.
7	(2) Each subsequent violation of this subchapter is punishable
8	by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500).
9	(b) If a person pleads guilty or nolo contendre to or the finder of
10	fact determines that the person was involved in a collision or accident while
11	in violation of this subchapter, a court shall in addition to any other
12	sentence, assess an additional fine of double the amount of the standard fine
13	imposed under subdivisions (a)(1) and (2) of this section.
14	
15	27-51-1609. Restrictions in school zones.
16	(a) Except as provided under subsection (b) of this section, a driver
17	of a motor vehicle shall not use a handheld wireless telephone while
18	operating a motor vehicle when passing a school building or school zone
19	during school hours when children are present and outside the building.
20	(b) A driver of a motor vehicle who is passing a school building or
21	school zone during school hours when children are present and outside the
22	building may use a handheld wireless telephone while operating a motor
23	vehicle for an emergency purpose.
24	(c) This section does not apply to law enforcement officers.
25	
26	27-51-1610. Restrictions in highway work zones.
27	(a) Except as provided under subsection (b) of this section, the
28	driver of a motor vehicle shall not use a handheld wireless telephone while
29	operating a motor vehicle in a highway work zone when a highway worker is
30	present.
31	(b) The driver of a motor vehicle who is in a highway work zone when a
32	highway worker is present may use a handheld wireless telephone while
33	operating a motor vehicle for an emergency purpose.
34	(c) This section does not apply to law enforcement officers.
35	
36	27-51-1602. Definitions.

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1	As used in this subchapter:
2	(1) "Emergency" means a situation in which a person is in need
3	of assistance from any of the following:
4	(A) Law enforcement personnel;
5	(B) Fire department personnel;
6	(C) Public safety personnel;
7	(D) Emergency medical personnel; or
8	(E) A 911 public safety communications center;
9	(2) "Texting" means reading from or manually entering data into
10	a wireless telecommunications device, including doing so for the purpose for
11	short message service texting, emailing, instant messaging, or engaging in
12	another form of electronic data retrieval or electronic data communication;
13	(3) "Wireless interactive communication" means talking, typing,
14	texting, emailing, or accessing information on the internet via Wi-Fi,
15	cellular data, or similar means; and
16	(4)(A) "Wireless telecommunications device" means a handheld
17	cellular telephone, a text-messaging device, a personal digital assistant, a
18	stand-alone computer, or a substantially similar wireless device that is
19	readily removable from a vehicle and is used to talk or type, send, or read
20	text or data through manual input.
21	(B) "Wireless telecommunications device" does not include
22	<u>a:</u>
23	(i) Citizens band radio;
24	(ii) Citizens band radio hybrid;
25	(iii) Commercial two-way radio communication device;
26	(iv) Two-way radio transmitter or receiver used by a
27	<u>licensee of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur Radio</u>
28	Service;
29	(v) Hands-free wireless telephone or device; or
30	(vi) Global positioning or navigation device system.
31	
32	27-51-1603. Restrictions on drivers under 18 years of age.
33	(a) Except as provided under subsection (b) of this section, a driver
34	of a motor vehicle who is under eighteen (18) years of age shall not use a
35	wireless telecommunications device or a hands-free wireless telephone or
36	device while operating a motor vehicle.

1	(b) A driver of a motor vehicle who is under eighteen (18) years of
2	age may use a wireless telecommunications device or a hands-free wireless
3	telephone or device while operating a motor vehicle only in an emergency.
4	
5	27-51-1604. Restrictions on drivers at least 18 years of age but under
6	21 years of age.
7	(a)(1) Except as provided under subsection (b) of this section, a
8	driver of a motor vehicle who is at least eighteen (18) years of age but
9	under twenty-one (21) years of age shall not use a wireless
10	telecommunications device for wireless interactive communication while
11	operating a motor vehicle.
12	(2) A driver of a motor vehicle who is at least eighteen (18)
13	years of age but under twenty-one (21) years of age may use a hands-free
14	wireless telephone or device for wireless interactive communication while
15	operating a motor vehicle.
16	(b) A driver of a motor vehicle who is at least eighteen (18) years of
17	age but under twenty-one (21) years of age may use a wireless
18	telecommunications device for wireless interactive communication while
19	operating a motor vehicle only in an emergency.
20	
21	27-51-1605. Restrictions in school zones.
22	(a) Except as provided under subsection (b) of this section, a driver
23	of a motor vehicle shall not use a wireless telecommunications device while
24	operating a motor vehicle when passing a school building or school zone
25	during school hours when children are present and outside the building.
26	(b) A driver of a motor vehicle who is passing a school building or
27	school zone during school hours when children are present and outside the
28	building may use a wireless telecommunications device while operating a motor
29	vehicle only in an emergency.
30	(c) This section does not apply to a law enforcement officer engaged
31	in the performance of his or her official duties.
32	
33	27-51-1606. Restrictions in highway work zones.
34	(a) Except as provided under subsection (b) of this section, a driver
35	of a motor vehicle shall not use a wireless telecommunications device while
36	operating a motor vehicle in a highway work zone when a highway worker is

2	(b) A driver of a motor vehicle who is in a highway work zone when a
