20	This subchapter is known and may be cited as "Paul's Law: To Prohibit
21	Drivers From Using a Wireless Communications Device While Operating a Motor
22	Vehicle".
23	
24	27-51-1502. Purpose.
25	The purpose of this subchapter is to:
26	(1) Improve the safety of the roads for all drivers and
27	passengers by prohibiting a driver of a motor vehicle from engaging in text
28	messaging;
29	(2) Prevent accidents caused by the distractive practice of text
30	messaging while operating a motor vehicle;
31	(3) Preserve human life and maintain the safety of the citizens
32	of the State of Arkansas and visitors to our state by taking steps to reduce
33	motor vehicle accidents, injuries, and deaths;
34	(4) Reduce health care costs, health insurance rates, and
35	automobile insurance rates by attempting to reduce the number of motor
36	vehicle accidents that cause injury, death, and property damage; and

1	(5) Reduce the amount of time that law enforcement and the court
2	system work on accidents and offenses arising out of motor vehicle accidents
3	caused by drivers who are distracted by sending or reading text messages.
4	
5	27-51-1503. Definitions.
6	As used in this subchapter:
7	(1) "Access, read, or post to a social networking site" means
8	using a wireless telecommunications device to interact with a web-based
9	service that allows a person to:
10	(A) Construct a profile within a bounded system;
11	(B) Articulate a list of other members with whom the
12	person shares a connection; and
13	(C) Communicate with other members of the site;
14	(2)(A) "Wireless telecommunications device" means a cellular
15	telephone, a text-messaging device, a personal digital assistant, a stand-
16	alone computer, or a substantially similar wireless device that is readily
17	removable from the vehicle and is used to write, send, or read text or data
18	through manual input.
19	(B) "Wireless telecommunications device" does not include
20	a:
21	(i) Citizens band radio;
22	(ii) Citizens band radio hybrid;
23	(iii) Commercial two-way radio communication device
24	(iv) Two-way radio transmitter or receiver used by a
25	licensee of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur Radio
26	Service; or
27	(v) Hands-free wireless telephone or device; and
28	(3) "Write, send, or read a text-based communication" means
29	using a wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with a
30	person by using a text-based communication commonly referred to as a text
31	message, instant message, or electronic mail.
32	
33	27-51-1504. Use of wireless telecommunications device when driving.
34	(a)(1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section
35	a driver of a motor vehicle shall not operate a motor vehicle while using a
36	wireless telecommunications device to:

1	(A) Write, send, or read a text-based communication; or
2	(B) Access, read, or post to a social networking site.
3	(2) A driver of a motor vehicle is not in violation of
4	subdivision (a)(1) of this section if he or she reads, selects, or enters a
5	telephone number or name in a wireless telecommunications device for the
6	purpose of making a telephone call.
7	(b) A person is exempt from the requirements of this section if he or
8	she is:
9	(1) Performing official duties as a certified law enforcement
10	officer, firefighter, ambulance driver, or emergency medical technician;
11	(2) Operating a motor vehicle while using a wireless
12	telecommunications device to:
13	(A) Report illegal activity;
14	(B) Summon medical or other emergency assistance;
15	(C) Prevent injury to a person or property;
16	(D) Relay information between a transit or for-hire
17	operator dispatcher, if the wireless telecommunications device is permanently
18	affixed to the motor vehicle; or
19	(E) Navigate using a global positioning system; or
20	(3) A physician or healthcare provider using a wireless
21	telecommunications device to communicate with a hospital, health clinic, or
22	the office of the physician, or to provide for the health care or medical
23	emergency of a person.
24	
25	27-51-1505. Preemption.
26	This subchapter supersedes and preempts all county or municipal
27	ordinances regarding the use of a handheld wireless telephone for wireless
28	interactive communication while operating a motor vehicle.
29	
30	27-51-1506. Penalties.
31	(a)(1) A violation of this subchapter is punishable by a fine of not
32	more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for the first offense.
33	(2) Each subsequent violation of this subchapter is punishable

5	(3) Preserve human life and maintain the safety of the citizens
6	of the State of Arkansas and visitors to our state by taking steps to reduce
7	motor vehicle accidents, injuries, and deaths;
8	(4) Reduce healthcare costs, health insurance rates, and
9	automobile insurance rates by attempting to reduce the number of motor
10	vehicle accidents that cause injury, death, and property damage;
11	(5) Reduce the amount of time that law enforcement and the court
12	system work on motor vehicle accidents and offenses arising out of motor
13	vehicle accidents caused by drivers who are distracted by the use of wireless
14	telecommunications devices; and
15	(6) Provide drivers, passengers, and law enforcement with a
16	clear and concise statement of the law concerning the use of wireless
17	telecommunications devices cell phones and the internet while operating a
18	motor vehicle.
