### Subtitle

14 AN ACT FOR THE ARKANSAS STATE GAME AND  
15 FISH COMMISSION APPROPRIATION FOR THE  
16 2019-2020 FISCAL YEAR.  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the  
23 Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the

16 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Arkansas  
 17 State Game and Fish Commission for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the following  
 18 maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra  
 19 Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one hundred  
 20 eighty-five (185) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of  
 21 pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and  
 22 Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate  
 23 classification.

25 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,  
 26 to the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission, to be payable from the Game  
 27 Protection Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Arkansas  
 28 State Game and Fish Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - FERAL HOG ERADICATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission, to be payable from the Game Protection Fund, for personal services, operating expenses and grants for the eradication efforts of feral hogs of the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following:

Section 8. Arkansas Code Title 15, Chapter 41, Subchapter 1, is amended to add additional sections to read as follows:

15-41-121. Extra help restrictions.

An employee of the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission who is employed as extra help may not, in a fiscal year:

(1) Receive an amount to exceed eighty-five percent (85%) of the maximum annual salary for a comparable position under:

(A) The Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, § 21-5-201 et seq., or its successor; or

1 (B) The appropriation act applicable to the commission for  
2 the fiscal year at issue; or

3 (2) Be employed for a period of time to exceed one thousand eight  
4 hundred (1,800) hours.

5  
6 15-41-122. Cost-of-living increases and merit pay.

7 (a) Employees of the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission may  
8 receive cost-of-living and merit pay adjustments at the discretion of the  
9 commission.

10 (b) The commission may develop and establish a merit pay system that  
11 shall be reviewed by the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is  
12 in session, the Joint Budget Committee.

13 (c) The commission may establish merit payments as either of the  
14 following, based on sufficiency of funding:

15 (1) An increase to an employee's base salary; or

16 (2) A lump-sum payment.

17 (d) Commission employees shall be evaluated using an instrument  
18 developed by the commission that incorporates performance evaluation  
19 standards.

20 (e)(1) If cost-of-living or merit pay adjustments are awarded,  
21 employees reaching the maximum rate of pay for their respective  
22 classifications may receive merit pay or cost-of-living adjustments in a  
23 lump-sum payment.

24 (2) Additional compensation under this section shall not be  
25 construed as exceeding the line item maximum for that position  
26 classification.

27  
28 15-41-123. Compensation differentials.

29 (a)(1) The Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission may pay a  
30 compensation differential under this section to an employee occupying a  
31 regularly appropriated position in an amount not to exceed twelve percent  
32 (12%) of an employee's base salary.

33 (2) An employee may be paid more than one (1) compensation  
34 differential under this section, provided the cumulative total of any  
35 compensation differentials paid under this section shall not exceed twenty-  
36 five percent (25%) of the employee's base salary.

1 (b) A compensation differential shall be reviewed by the Legislative  
2 Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget  
3 Committee.

4 (c) The commission shall demonstrate the need for a compensation  
5 differential and submit a plan to the Legislative Council or, if the General  
6 Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, identifying the position  
7 or classification eligible for the differential.

8 (d) A compensation differential authorized under this section includes  
9 only the following:

10 (1) A shift differential;

11 (2) A hazardous-duty differential;

12 (3) A certification differential; and

13 (4) A second-language differential.

14 (e) An employee who receives additional compensation under this section  
15 who moves into a position that is not authorized to receive the compensation  
16 differential shall have the compensation differential removed from his or her  
17 salary.

18 (f) If granting additional compensation under this section has the  
19 effect of exceeding the line item maximum assigned to the employee's position  
20 or classification, the additional compensation shall not be construed as  
21 exceeding the line item maximum for that position or classification.

22  
23 15-41-124. Arkansas Hunters Feeding the Hungry Program.

24 (a) The Arkansas Hunters Feeding the Hungry Program is designed to:

25 (1) Share the harvest of an abundant resource with Arkansans who  
26 are in need of food;

27 (2) Partner with the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission to  
28 provide a solution for a healthy, balanced deer herd;

29 (3) Provide a much-needed free, low fat, high-protein food source  
30 to agencies and organizations that provide meals across Arkansas; and

31 (4) Create a provider purpose for hunters who participate in the  
32 program, which allows them to give back and share with others.

33 (b) The commission may establish a check-off or other appropriate  
34 method by which to raise revenue for support of the program.

35 (c) The intent of this section is to encourage the commission to  
36 examine opportunities available to provide support for the program.



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2 15-41-125. Overtime payments.

3 (a)(1) If approved by the Director of the Arkansas State Game and Fish  
4 Commission, the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission may make overtime  
5 payments to wildlife officers or other employees that are currently assigned  
6 or may be assigned by the director or his or her designee to special law  
7 enforcement task forces, special operations, or other special programs  
8 reimbursable to the commission by federal or local authorities.

9 (2) Overtime payments under subdivision (a)(1) of this section  
10 shall be made from funds and appropriations provided for overtime  
11 payments.

12 (b) Overtime payments under this section shall be:

13 (1) Processed through the State Accounting System; and

14 (2) In addition to the regular salaries and benefits accruing to  
15 the employees eligible for overtime payments under this section.

16  
17 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PAYMENT  
19 OF REWARDS. Payment of rewards shall be from the Game Protection Fund from  
20 the Commission's Maintenance and General Operation appropriation as herein  
21 appropriated in the Operating Expenses line item of the Operations  
22 appropriation.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~  
24 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

25  
26 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
28 PROVISION. After receiving approval from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the  
29 State, and prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget  
30 Committee, the Agency is authorized to transfer appropriation from any line  
31 item authorized in the Operations appropriation to any other line item  
32 authorized in the Operations appropriation and the Agency is authorized to  
33 transfer appropriation from any line item authorized in the Gas Lease  
34 Revenues appropriation to any other line item authorized in the same section.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~  
36 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

1  
2 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

4 PROMOTIONAL ITEMS. The Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission is hereby  
5 authorized to purchase from the Maintenance & General Operation  
6 Classifications in the Operations Appropriation provided by this Act for  
7 promotional items in an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars  
8 (\$50,000), as authorized by the Director of the Commission to meet fish and  
9 wildlife conservations and education needs.

10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019  
11 through June 30 2020.

12  
13 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
14 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
15 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
16 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
17 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
18 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
19 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
20 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

21  
22 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
23 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
24 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
25 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of  
26 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
27 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
28 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm  
29 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
30 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
31 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
32 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
