22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 14-14-308 is amended to read as follows:

24	(a)(1)(A) Whene	ever, due to an emergency resulting f	rom the effects of

All acts 11 of the governing body and officers shall be as valid and binding as if 12 performed within the territorial limits of their political subdivision. (c) "Political subdivisions" shall mean As used in this section, 13 14 "political subdivisions" means all duly formed and constituted governing 15 bodies created and established under authority of the Arkansas Constitution 16 and laws of this state. 17 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 18 19 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there are meeting places of governing bodies across the state that are in disrepair; that often a 20 meeting place needs to be closed and relocated temporarily; and that 21 22 this act is immediately necessary because under current law a meeting place cannot be set up temporarily unless an emergency arises due to 23 an enemy attack. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act 24 being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, 25 26 and safety shall become effective on: 27 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 28 29 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the 30 bill; or 31 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 32 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto. 33 34 35 /s/D.
