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1	(2) Sell such dwelling units and lots; and
2	(3) Deposit the funds derived therefrom in a Building Trades
3	Revolving Fund, which is created for that purpose.
4	(b) Riverside Vocational and Technical School may construct only non-
5	dwelling unit building projects for state agencies or for private, nonprofit
6	organizations, but not for the general public, in connection with the course
7	of training in the building trades.
8	(c)(l) As used in this subchapter, "secondary area technical center"
9	means a secondary area vocational center established under § 6-13-801 et seq.
10	or as defined by the Department of Career Education.
11	(2) A secondary area technical center is authorized to construct
12	single family dwelling units in connection with a course of training in the
13	building trades.
14	(3) This subsection does not authorize the purchase of land by a
15	secondary area technical center.
16	
17	6-51-502. Approval and notification requirements — Advance of funds.
18	(a) When a state-supported technical institute or secondary area
19	technical center offering courses of training in the building trades,
20	including carpentry, plumbing, bricklaying, and electrical wiring, desires to
21	participate in the program established in this subchapter, it shall first
22	obtain the written approval of the local building trades advisory committee
23	for the construction trades.
24	(b) Upon receipt of written approval, the technical institute or
25	secondary area technical center shall notify the Department of Career
26	Education of its intent to undertake the construction of a single family
27	dwelling unit or other building project under the program established in this
28	subchapter.
29	(c) Upon receipt of notice and subject to the availability of funds
30	therefor, the department may advance funds:
31	(1) To the technical institute from the Building Trades
32	Revolving Fund for the purchase of lots and building materials, supplies, and
33	fixtures to be used in the construction of the dwelling unit or other
34	building project; or
35	(2) To the secondary area technical center from the Building
36	Trades Revolving Fund for the purchase of building materials, supplies, and

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1	fixtures to be used in the construction of the single family dwelling unit or
2	other nonresidential building project.
3	
4	6-51-503. Procedure for purchase of lot.
5	When a technical institute is advanced funds from the Building Trades
6	Revolving Fund by the Department of Career Education as provided in this
7	subchapter, the technical institute shall, if it proposes to purchase a lot
8	on which to build the dwelling unit or other building project, cause notice
9	of the proposed purchase to be published in a newspaper of general
10	circulation in the area where it proposes to purchase the lot in order to
11	give persons in the area an opportunity to offer lots for sale to the school
12	for the construction of the dwelling unit or other building project.
13	
14	6-51-504. Dwelling unit construction - Restrictions - Exemptions.
15	(a) The Department of Career Education shall not advance funds to a
16	technical institute from the Building Trades Revolving Fund created in this
17	subchapter for the construction of more than one (1) dwelling unit or other
18	building project at any one (1) time or more than one (1) dwelling unit or
19	other building project in any twelve-month period.
20	(b) Riverside Vocational and Technical School and secondary area
21	technical centers are exempt from the provisions of this section.
22	
23	6-51-505. Applicability of state purchasing law and regulations.
24	All building materials, supplies, and fixtures used in the construction
25	of a dwelling unit or other building project as authorized in this subchapter
26	shall be purchased by the school:
27	(1) If the school is a technical institute, in accordance with
28	the state purchasing law and regulations; and
29	(2) If the school is a secondary area technical center, in
30	accordance with the purchasing laws and regulations governing its
31	administrative sponsor.
32	
33	6-51-506. Conformity to other standards.
34	Any dwelling unit or other building project constructed by a technical
35	institute or a secondary area technical center pursuant to this subchapter
36	shall conform to the local zoning and building code, if any, of the

1	municipality or area in which constructed and is subject to all requirements,
2	restrictions, and regulations of the locality in which located, the
3	Department of Health, and other public agencies, the same as if constructed
4	<del>by a private builder.</del>
5	
6	6-51-507. Sale of dwelling unit.
7	(a) Upon completion of a dwelling unit or other building project, the
8	governing body of the technical institute or secondary area technical center
9	shall cause the dwelling unit or building project to be appraised by a
10	qualified real estate appraiser.
11	(b)(1) Upon receipt of the appraisal, the governing body of the
12	technical institute or secondary area technical center shall cause notice to
13	be published in one (1) or more newspapers of general circulation in the area
14	that the dwelling unit or other building project will be sold by sealed bid
15	to the highest bidder above the appraised value thereof.
16	(2)(A) The notice shall state the location of the dwelling unit
17	or building project and the date, time, and place at which the sealed bids
18	will be received.
19	(B) The date shall be at least two (2) weeks after the
20	date of the publication of the notice.
21	(c) No dwelling unit or other building project shall be sold for an
22	amount less than the appraised value of the property.
23	(d)(l) If no bid equals or exceeds the appraised value of the
24	property, all bids shall be rejected, and the property shall again be
25	advertised and offered for sale as provided in subsection (b) of this section
26	within ninety (90) days after the first bid opening.
27	(2) This procedure of advertising for and receiving bids on the
28	property shall be continued until the property is sold.
29	(e) The provisions of this section do not apply to any building
30	project for a state agency, which shall reimburse the technical institute or
31	secondary area technical center for the actual costs incurred in the
32	completion of the project.
33	
34	6-51-508. Remittance of proceeds.
35	(a) All funds derived from reimbursement by a state agency or from the
36	sale of a dwelling unit or other building project constructed under the

1	provisions of this subchapter by a technical institute after deducting the
2	cost of the sale shall be remitted to the Department of Career Education for
3	deposit in the Building Trades Revolving Fund created in this subchapter.
4	(b) Upon the sale of a dwelling unit or other building project
5	constructed under the provisions of this subchapter by a secondary area
6	technical center:
7	(1)(A) The secondary area technical center shall remit to the
8	department the full amount of funds advanced for the project.
9	(B) The department shall deposit the funds into the
10	Building Trades Revolving Fund created in this subchapter; and
11	(2) The remaining proceeds, if any, shall be retained or any
12	loss absorbed by the secondary area technical center.
13	
14	6-51-509. Uses for Building Trades Revolving Fund.
15	All funds appropriated for the program established in this subchapter
16	together with funds derived from the sale of property and remitted to the
17	Department of Career Education and deposited in the Building Trades Revolving
18	Fund shall be used exclusively for the purpose of making advances to area
19	vocational schools for the purchase of lots, building materials, supplies,
20	and fixtures necessary to construct dwellings or other building projects on
21	the lots and to otherwise carry out the purposes of this subchapter.
22	
23	6-51-510. Disbursing officer.
24	The disbursing officer for the Department of Career Education shall be
25	disbursing officer for funds in the Building Trades Revolving Fund.
26	
27	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 19-5-1064, concerning the Building Trades
28	Revolving Fund, is repealed.
29	19-5-1064. Building Trades Revolving Fund.
30	(a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, the
31	Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be
32	known as the "Building Trades Revolving Fund".
33	(b) The fund shall consist of all funds appropriated for the building
34	trades program and from the sale of dwelling units constructed under the
35	provisions of § 6-51-501 et seq., there to be used exclusively for making
36	advances to technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers

1	for the purchase of lots, building materials, supplies, and fixtures
2	necessary to construct dwellings on such lots, as set out in § 6-51-501 et
3	<del>seq.</del>
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
