Upon approval 7 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the State Auditor shall be notified 8 as to the amount and the purposes for which the appropriation is to be made 9 and such appropriation as needed shall be established upon the books of the 10 Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided, 11 however, that in the event the total amount of transfer requested in any 12 fiscal year exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), the Chief Fiscal Officer 13 of the State shall seek prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or 14 Joint Budget Committee before the transfer shall be made.

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SECTION 71. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. POSITION 20 ESTABLISHMENT. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall have the authority to establish such positions as necessary for State agencies to process 21 22 payroll through the Arkansas Administrative Statewide Information System for 23 federal and state tax reporting purposes as necessary to comply with the 24 United States Internal Revenue Code (IRC), 2001-Code-Vol, Sec 3401 and 25 Treasury Regulations §31.3401(c)-1(a) and §1.1402(c)-2(b), and others which 26 govern the reporting of income and payment of withholding and matching taxes 27 for personal services. The positions established shall not be considered as 28 part of the total number of authorized positions for an agency and shall only 29 be considered as placeholders for payments to individuals who are board or 30 commission members or elected officials of the State that do not otherwise 31 receive salaries or wages as defined in Arkansas Code § 19-4-521 for their 32 personal services. Further, none of the positions established under this section shall imply eligibility for state retirement or state health 33 34 insurance benefits. The establishment of such positions shall not exceed 250 35 positions in any fiscal year.

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SECTION 72. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 3 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 5 AUTHORIZED - ARKANSAS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL. The Arkansas Children's Hospital 6 may request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to transfer funds made 7 available for the following by this Act sums not to exceed \$1,000,000 for the 8 Arkansas Children's Hospital Burn Center, \$700,000 for the Children's 9 Hospital Payments, \$600,000 for the Reproductive Health Monitoring, and 10 \$233,600 for the Intensive Care Nursery each fiscal year from the 11 Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account to the Department of Human Services 12 Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal 13 funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's 14 Hospital.

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16 The Arkansas Children's Hospital may also request the Chief Fiscal Officer of 17 the State to transfer the sum not to exceed \$1,000,000 each fiscal year from 18 the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account from funds made available by this Act 19 for the Intensive Care Nursery to the Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account. 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25 SECTION 73. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 27 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of 28 Information Systems is a cost recovery agency subject to the requirements of 29 the United States Office of Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost 30 Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost 31 Principles for Developing Cost Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for 32 Agreements with the Federal Government Implementation Guide for the Office of 33 Management and Budget Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal 34 rules, it is necessary to establish an Innovation and Project Development 35 appropriation and general revenue fund account within the Department of 36 Finance and Administration - Disbursing Officer for the Department of

1 Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise innovation 2 projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State that cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of Information 3 4 Systems will maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes. 5 Fund transfers may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the 6 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the 7 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the 8 Department of Information Systems for the amounts billed.

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12 SECTION 74. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. After the amounts to be made available to the 15 various technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers have 16 been determined as set out in Arkansas Code §§ 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-17 205(d)(2)(B), such documents as may be necessary shall be processed so that 18 funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the 19 State Treasury fund or fund account from which the technical institute or 20 comprehensive lifelong learning center draws its general revenue support. 21 Such funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 6.309% of the total funds 22 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during each fiscal year. 23 In the event that a technical college, community college or educational 24 institution which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund 25 as determined by law transfers from the Arkansas Technical College and 26 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies 27 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force 28 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational 29 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of 30 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

The funds distributed under Arkansas Code § 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall be deposited into the Skills Development Fund to be used only for personal services, grants, operation, support, and improvement of occupational, vocational, technical, and workforce development programs by the Department of Career Education - Office of Skills Development. The distributions of

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funds under Arkansas Code § 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall not apply to proceeds allocated to schools, colleges and educational institutions under Arkansas Code §§ 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B).

TRANSFER 10 PROCEDURES - PERSONAL SERVICES EXTRA HELP. In the event that there is not 11 sufficient appropriation provided for by the General Assembly for payment of 12 personal services related to Extra Help for any state agency for the period 13 ending June 30, 2020 2021, said agency may request a transfer from 14 appropriations provided for Personal Services Extra Help in the Miscellaneous 15 Transfers Section herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating 16 clearly the amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of 17 the State, and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council 18 or Joint Budget Committee, the State Auditor shall be notified as to the 19 amount and the purposes for which said appropriation is to be made. The 20 appropriation shall then be established upon the books of the Department of 21 Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided further, that if 22 desired, said appropriation shall be supplemental to those regularly 23 appropriated for such purposes by the General Assembly for the agency. 24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019 25 2020 through June 30, 2020 2021.

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27 SECTION 76. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 29 INTRASTATE METRO PLANNING GRANTS. As referenced in Section 9 of Act 637 of 30 1995, the authorized funding for Intrastate Metro Planning Grants that are 31 evenly distributed among planning and development districts under the 32 Miscellaneous Grants and Expenses Section of this Act shall include the West 33 Central Arkansas Economic Development District.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2019}{35}$ 35 $\frac{2020}{2020}$ through June 30, $\frac{2020}{2021}$.

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1 SECTION 77. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND USAGE AUTHORIZED. The Arkansas Children's Hospital President and C.E.O. may 3 4 request the Department of Human Services-Division of Medical Services to 5 retain in the Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not 6 to exceed \$1,000,000 for funds made available by the act to be used to match 7 federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's 8 Hospital.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019

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12 SECTION 78. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 14 PROCEDURES - MEDICAL MARIJUANA IMPLEMENTATION AND REGULATION. In the event 15 that sufficient appropriation is not provided by the General Assembly for 16 expenditures resulting from the implementation and regulation of the Arkansas 17 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 for any state agency, pursuant to 18 Arkansas Code § 19-4-701 et seq., said agency shall request a transfer of 19 appropriation from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating clearly the 20 amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State said 21 appropriations shall be established upon the books of the Department of 22 Finance and Administration in compliance with the applicable classifications 23 of appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-521 through 19-4-24 527.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019
26 2020 through June 30, 2020 2021.

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SECTION 79. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 28 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 30 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 31 may transfer from his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and 32 the Auditor of State from the Medical Marijuana Implementation and Operations 33 Fund to various state agencies' funds the amounts necessary to fund the 34 expenses for the implementation, administration, and/or enforcement of the 35 Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019

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3 SECTION 80. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BLANKET 5 BOND PROGRAM. The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration 6 is authorized to transfer Appropriation between the Blanket Surety Bond 7 Program appropriations authorized for State Employees (Appropriation 2DM), 8 County Employees (Appropriation 2DN), Municipal Employees (Appropriation 2DP) 9 and Public School Employees (Appropriation 2DQ).

10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019
11 <u>2020</u> through June 30, 2020 <u>2021</u>.

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SECTION 81. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 15 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND 16 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided 17 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or 18 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the 19 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions 20 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 21 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional 22 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. 23 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may 24 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the 25 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose, 26 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval 27 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and 28 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) herein, the Department of 29 Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of appropriation on 30 the books of the Department of Finance and Administration and the State 31 Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of appropriations 32 as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525. 33 (iii) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein, 34 including requests that establish a new commitment item or new appropriation 35 shall require prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or if

36 meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session the Joint Budget Committee.

1 Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be (iv) 2 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change 3 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested. 4 (v) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or 5 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. 6 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the 7 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General 8 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more 9 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or 10 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is 11 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight 12 by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 13 Committee as provided by this section. 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31 SECTION 83. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 32 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 33 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 34 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 35 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 36 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or

summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

4	SECTION 84. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
5	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
6	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
7	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2020 is essential to the operation of
8	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the
9	exception that Sections 38-43 in this Act shall be in full force and effect
10	from and after the date of its passage and approval, and that in the event of
11	an extension of the Legislative Session, the delay in the effective date of
12	this Act beyond July 1, 2020, with the exception that Sections 38-43 in this
13	Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage
14	and approval, could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and
15	provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is
16	hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate
17	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force
18	and effect from and after July 1, 2020; with the exception that Sections 38-
19	43 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of
20	its passage and approval.
