Upon approval by the President and the Board 19 of Trustees, such funds shall be administered by the Chancellor, who shall 20 assure that the total amount expended for such purposes does not exceed one 21 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) each fiscal year or so much thereof 22 as may be authorized by the Board of Trustees. The funds authorized by this 23 Section shall come from a source other than state tax dollars appropriated by 24 the General Assembly or charges made to students for tuition, fees, room and 25 board, or other purposes. Each year the Chancellor shall furnish to the 26 President of the University of Arkansas, the Board of Trustees, and the 27 Arkansas Legislative Joint Auditing Committee a report showing for each 28 expenditure the date, the amount, the names of persons to whom the 29 expenditure was made, and the purpose for which the expenditure was made.
