
## Subtitle

14 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR  
15 MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR THE  
16 2020-2021 FISCAL YEAR.  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
21

22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established  
23 for the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2020-2021 fiscal

32 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for  
 33 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2020-2021 fiscal  
 34 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be  
 35 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such  
 36 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,

1 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform  
2 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the  
3 appropriate classification.

4  
5 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
7 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the  
8 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-  
9 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from  
10 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a  
11 Nursing PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not  
12 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.  
13 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as  
14 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)  
15 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget  
16 request.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
18 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

19  
20 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
22 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas  
23 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary  
24 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds  
25 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a  
26 UAMS Temporary Pool: five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay  
27 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this  
28 Act.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
30 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

31  
32 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,  
33 to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, to be payable from the  
34 University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund, for personal services and  
35 operating expenses of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the

31 (a) A local entity shall coordinate with the Arkansas Geographic  
32 Information Systems Office to provide mapping information to the Arkansas  
33 Spatial Data Infrastructure (ASDI) for preparation of legal descriptions and  
34 digital mapping for the relevant incorporated or unincorporated areas.

35 (b) A local entity that has been awarded a state or federal grant or  
36 loan shall provide information concerning broadband mapping to the Arkansas

1 Geographic Information Systems Office in compliance with the Arkansas  
2 Geographic Information Systems Office Policy Statement PS-01, Arkansas  
3 Spatial Data Infrastructure (ASDI) Data Loading and Retirement Procedures.

5 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

6  
7 SECTION 52. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING  
9 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences  
10 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,  
11 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Parking Services from Fees to  
12 War Memorial.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
14 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

15  
16 SECTION 53. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
18 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship  
19 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and  
20 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing  
21 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such  
22 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for  
23 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
25 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

26  
27 SECTION 54. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL  
29 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging  
30 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of  
31 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support  
32 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor  
33 is authorized for the ~~2019-2020~~ 2020-2021 fiscal year a pool of seven hundred  
34 (700) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These positions are  
35 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event  
36 that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated clinical or

1 research programs that are initiated during the ~~2019-2020~~ 2020-2021 fiscal  
2 year require additional positions, either in title, in classification, or in  
3 number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the General Assembly in  
4 the Regular Salaries - Operations section of this Act.

5 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to  
6 access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in  
7 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the  
8 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the  
9 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional  
10 positions exists. Only medical or research positions shall be established  
11 under this provision. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for  
12 Medical Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification  
13 of allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool"  
14 to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher  
15 Education, and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee  
16 for review. The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles  
17 and salaries of personnel who have been employed in positions established  
18 from this pool and the source and duration of funds associated with the  
19 positions.

20 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests  
21 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as  
22 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be  
23 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

24 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency  
25 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by  
26 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the  
27 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has  
28 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be  
29 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.  
30 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in  
31 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the  
32 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and  
33 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization  
34 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint  
35 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the  
36 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is

1 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the  
2 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a  
3 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
5 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

6  
7 SECTION 55. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ON-CALL  
9 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized  
10 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires  
11 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff  
12 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day  
13 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform  
14 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the  
15 appropriate compensation.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
17 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

18  
19 SECTION 56. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED  
21 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event  
22 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas  
23 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric  
24 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount  
25 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven  
26 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as  
27 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year  
28 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to  
29 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents  
30 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical  
31 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide  
32 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of  
33 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the  
34 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,  
35 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts  
36 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will

1 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount  
2 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for  
3 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if  
4 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve  
5 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars  
6 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of  
7 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and  
8 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of  
9 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of  
10 Pediatrics.

11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
12 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

13  
14 SECTION 57. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHS AND  
16 UAMS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The University of Arkansas for Medical  
17 Sciences (UAMS) and the Department of Human Services shall enter into a  
18 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to determine any reimbursement,  
19 administrative charges or fees for the State Olmstead plan or for processing  
20 or administration of State match funds charges as reimbursement funding for  
21 federal financial participation under the Medicaid's Disproportionate Share  
22 (DSH) reimbursement program or any other arrangements or agreements that  
23 could benefit UAMS for Fiscal Year 2019 and forward upon prior review of the  
24 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint  
25 Budget Committee.

26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2019~~  
27 2020 through June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021.

28  
29 SECTION 58. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
30 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
31 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
32 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
33 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
34 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures  
35 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
36 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of

1 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
2 with in disbursement of said funds.

3  
4 SECTION 59. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
5 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
6 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
7 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
8 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
9 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
10 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
11 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

12  
13 SECTION 60. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
14 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
15 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
16 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2020 is essential to the operation of  
17 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
18 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
19 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2020 could work irreparable harm  
20 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
21 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
22 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
23 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2020.
