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1	(3) "Supported decision-making" means a process of
2	supporting and accommodating an adult with a disability to enable him or her
3	to make life decisions without impeding the self-determination of the adult
4	with a disability, including without limitation decisions related to:
5	(A) Where the adult with a disability wants to live;
6	(B) The services, supports, and medical care the
7	adult with a disability wants to receive;
8	(C) With whom the adult with a disability wants to
9	live; and
10	(D) Where the adult with a disability wants to work;
11	(4) "Supported decision-making agreement" means an
12	agreement between an adult with a disability and a supporter entered into
13	under this subchapter; and
14	(5) "Supporter" means an adult who has entered into a
15	supported decision-making agreement with an adult with a disability.
16	
17	<u>28-65-803.</u> Purpose.
18	The purpose of this subchapter is to recognize a less restrictive
19	alternative to guardianship for an adult with a disability who needs
20	assistance with decisions regarding daily living but who is not considered an
21	incapacitated person for purposes of establishing a guardianship under this
22	<u>chapter.</u>
23	
24	28-65-804. Scope of supported decision-making agreement.
25	An adult with a disability, without undue influence or coercion, may
26	voluntarily enter into a supported decision-making agreement with one (1) or
27	more supporters under which the adult with a disability authorizes a
28	supporter to do one (1) or more of the following:
29	(1) Provide supported decision-making, including without
30	limitation assistance in understanding the options, responsibilities, and
31	consequences of the life decisions of the adult with a disability, without
32	making the life decision on behalf of the adult with a disability;
33	(2) Assist the adult with a disability in accessing, collecting,
34	and obtaining information that is relevant to a life decision, including
35	without limitation information from the adult with a disability's medical,
36	psychological, financial, educational, and treatment records;

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1	(3) Assist the adult with a disability in understanding the
2	information described in subdivision (2) of this section; and
3	(4) Assist the adult with a disability in communicating the life
4	decision of the adult with a disability to the appropriate person.
5	
6	<u>28-65-805. Authority of supporter — Nature of relationship.</u>
7	(a) A supporter may exercise the authority granted to the supporter in
8	the supported decision-making agreement.
9	(b) The supporter owes to the adult with a disability the fiduciary
10	duties listed in the form provided under § 28-65-812, regardless of whether
11	that form is used for the supported decision-making agreement.
12	(c) The relationship between an adult with a disability and the
13	supporter with whom the adult with a disability has entered into a supported
14	decision-making agreement:
15	(1) Is one of trust and confidence; and
16	(2) Does not undermine the decision-making authority of the
17	adult with a disability.
18	(d) The following individuals shall not serve as a supporter:
19	(1) An employer or employee of the adult with a disability;
20	(2) An individual against whom the adult with a disability has
21	<u>or has had a restraining order; or</u>
22	(3) An individual providing direct paid support services to the
23	adult with a disability.
24	
25	28-65-806. Designation of alternate supporter in certain
26	circumstances.
27	In order to prevent a conflict of interest, if an adult with a
28	disability determines that the supporter with whom the adult with a
29	disability has entered into a supported decision-making agreement is the most
30	appropriate person to provide supports and services to the adult with a
31	disability for which the supporter will be compensated, the adult with a
32	disability may amend the supported decision-making agreement to designate an
33	alternate person to act as the supporter of the adult with a disability for
34	the limited purpose of participating in person-centered planning related to
35	the provision of those supports and services.
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1	28-65-807. Term of agreement.
2	(a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this section, the
3	supported decision-making agreement extends until terminated by either party
4	or by the terms of the agreement.
5	(b) The supported decision-making agreement is terminated if:
6	(1) The Adult Protective Services Unit of the Department of
7	Human Services finds that the adult with a disability has been abused,
8	neglected, or exploited by the supporter;
9	(2) The supporter is found criminally liable for conduct
10	described in subdivision (b)(l) of this section;
11	(3)(A) A temporary or permanent guardian of the person or
12	guardian of the estate is appointed for the adult with a disability.
13	(B) The termination of a supported decision-making
14	agreement under subdivision (b)(3)(A) of this section does not prohibit an
15	adult with a disability from executing another supported decision-making
16	agreement if the guardianship is terminated; or
17	(4) An order is entered that legally prohibits the supporter
18	from contact with the adult with a disability.
19	(c) A supporter who is a party to the supported decision-making
20	agreement shall not interfere, impede, or prevent the Adult Protective
21	Services Unit of the Department of Human Services from carrying out an
22	investigation of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of the adult who is a party
23	to the agreement.
24	
25	28-65-808. Access to personal information.
26	(a) A supporter is only authorized to assist the adult with a
27	disability in accessing, collecting, or obtaining information that is
28	relevant to a life decision covered under the supported decision-making
29	agreement.
30	(b) If a supporter assists an adult with a disability in accessing,
31	collecting, or obtaining the adult with a disability's personal information,
32	including protected health information under the Health Insurance Portability
33	and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-191, or educational records
34	under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. §
35	1232g, as it existed on January 1, 2021, the supporter shall ensure the
36	information is kept privileged and confidential, as applicable, and protected

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1	from unauthorized access, use, or disclosure.
2	(c) The existence of a supported decision-making agreement does not
3	preclude an adult with a disability from seeking personal information without
4	the assistance of a supporter.
5	
6	28-65-809. Authorizing and witnessing of supported decision-making
7	agreement.
8	(a) A supported decision-making agreement shall be signed voluntarily,
9	without coercion or undue influence, by the adult with a disability and the
10	supporter in the presence of two (2) or more attesting witnesses or a notary
11	public.
12	(b) If the supported decision-making agreement is signed before two
13	(2) or more attesting witnesses, the attesting witnesses are required to be
14	at least eighteen (18) years of age.
15	
16	28-65-810. Reliance on supported decision-making agreement —
17	Limitation of liability.
18	(a) A person who receives the original or a copy of a supported
19	decision-making agreement shall rely on the agreement.
20	(b) A person is not subject to criminal or civil liability and has not
21	engaged in professional misconduct for an act or omission if the act or
22	omission is done in good faith and in reliance on a supported decision-making
23	agreement.
24	
25	28-65-811. Reporting of suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation.
26	If a person who receives a copy of a supported decision-making
27	agreement or is otherwise aware of the existence of a supported decision-
28	making agreement has cause to believe that the adult with a disability is
29	being abused, neglected, or exploited by the supporter, the person shall
30	report the alleged abuse, neglect, or exploitation to the Adult Protective
31	Services Unit of the Department of Human Services.
32	
33	28-65-812. Form of supported decision-making agreement.
34	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a supported
35	decision moltime component is valid only if it is in substantially the

6	this supported decision-making agreement, you have a duty to:
7	(1) Act in good faith;
8	(2) Act within the authority granted in this agreement;
9	(3) Act loyally and without self-interest; and
10	(4) Avoid conflicts of interest.

2	() A release allowing my supporter to see educational records under
3	the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as
4	it existed on January 1, 2021, is attached.
