1	companies often use advertising and marketing materials to promote their		
2	services; that in some cases, the home security and alarm companies that are		
3	advertising or sending marketing materials to the citizens of Arkansas are		
4	not licensed in this state or do not list the company name on the advertising		
5	or marketing materials; that the lack of licensing information and the		
6	company name from advertising and marketing materials can result in confusion		
7	to the consumers of Arkansas and may constitute deceptive advertising and		
8	marketing; and that this act is immediately necessary to protect the		
9	consumers of Arkansas from deceptive advertising and marketing materials.		
10	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately		
11	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
12	become effective on:		
13	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
14	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
15	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
16	bill; or		
17	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
18	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
