4	advertising or sending marketing materials to the citizens of Arkansas are		
5	not licensed in this state or do not list the company name on the advertising		
6	or marketing materials; that the lack of licensing information and the		
7	company name from advertising and marketing materials can result in confusion		
8	to the consumers of Arkansas and may constitute deceptive advertising and		
9	marketing; and that this act is immediately necessary to protect the		
10	consumers of Arkansas from deceptive advertising and marketing materials.		
11	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately		
12	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
13	become effective on:		
14	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
