34 federal and state tax reporting purposes as necessary to comply with the
35 United States Internal Revenue Code (IRC), 2001-Code-Vol, Sec 3401 and
36 Treasury Regulations §31.3401(c)-1(a) and §1.1402(c)-2(b), and others which

1 govern the reporting of income and payment of withholding and matching taxes
2 for personal services. The positions established shall not be considered as
3 part of the total number of authorized positions for an agency and shall only
4 be considered as placeholders for payments to individuals who are board or
5 commission members or elected officials of the State that do not otherwise
6 receive salaries or wages as defined in Arkansas Code § 19-4-521 for their
7 personal services. Further, none of the positions established under this
8 section shall imply eligibility for state retirement or state health
9 insurance benefits. The establishment of such positions shall not exceed 250
10 positions in any fiscal year.

11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~

14 SECTION 69. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
16 AUTHORIZED - ARKANSAS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL. The Arkansas Children's Hospital
17 may request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to transfer funds made
18 available for the following by this Act sums not to exceed \$1,000,000 for the
19 Arkansas Children's Hospital Burn Center, \$700,000 for the Children's
20 Hospital Payments, \$600,000 for the Reproductive Health Monitoring, and
21 \$233,600 for the Intensive Care Nursery each fiscal year from the
22 Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account to the Department of Human Services
23 Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal

1 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of
2 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems is a cost
3 recovery agency subject to the requirements of the United States Office of
4 Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost Principles for State, Local and
5 Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost Principles for Developing Cost
6 Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for Agreements with the Federal
7 Government Implementation Guide for the Office of Management and Budget
8 Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal rules, it is necessary
9 to establish an Innovation and Project Development appropriation and general
10 revenue fund account within the Department of Finance and Administration -
11 Disbursing Officer for the Department of Transformation & Shared Services -
12 Division of Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise
13 innovation projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State
14 that cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of
15 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems will
16 maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes. Fund transfers
17 may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the approval of the
18 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the Arkansas
19 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the Department of
20 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems for the
21 amounts billed.

31 funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the

5 SECTION 76. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

7 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
8 may transfer from his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and
9 the Auditor of State from the Medical Marijuana Implementation and Operations
10 Fund to various state agencies' funds the amounts necessary to fund the
11 expenses for the implementation, administration, and/or enforcement of the

27 SECTION 78. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

29 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND
30 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided
31 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or
32 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the
33 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions
34 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
35 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional
36 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

1 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may
2 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the
3 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose,
4 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval
5 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and
6 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) herein, the Department of
7 Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of appropriation on

11 (iii) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein,

15 (iv) Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be
16 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change
17 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested.

18 (v) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or
19 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly.
20 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
21 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General
22 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more
23 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or
24 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is
25 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight

9 SECTION 80. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
10 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
11 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
12 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
13 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
14 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
15 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
16 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18 SECTION 81. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
19 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
20 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
21 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of
22 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the
23 exception that Sections 37 and 39 in this Act shall be in full force and
24 effect from and after the date of its passage and approval, and that in the
25 event of an extension of the Legislative Session, the delay in the effective
26 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021, with the exception that Sections 37 and
27 39 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of
28 its passage and approval, could work irreparable harm upon the proper
29 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
30 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
31 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in
32 full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021; with the exception that
33 Sections 37 and 39 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and
34 after the date of its passage and approval.
