7	(1) Explicitly consented to by the patient or the patient's
8	representative;
9	(2) Medically related to the planned or performed procedure;
10	(3) Performed by a student or trainee who has been made known to
11	the patient as being part of his or her care team; and
12	(4) Conducted under the direct supervision of an educator.
13	(c) If a pelvic examination is performed on an unconscious or
14	anesthetized patient by a healthcare professional or a student or trainee in
15	a clinical setting under subdivisions (a)(2)-(4) of this section, the
16	healthcare professional or student or trainee shall notify the patient at a
17	reasonable time before the patient is discharged from the care of the
18	healthcare professional or the student or trainee.
19	(d) A violation of this section shall constitute grounds for
20	disciplinary action by the appropriate licensing board or medical education
21	program.
