18 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REPORTING
20 REQUIREMENTS. For the purposes of the fund transfers provided for in the
21 preceding Fund Transfer Provision special language section, the amounts
22 transferred shall not be considered as part of any statutory limitation on
23 the use of funds for administration of programs of the ~~Department~~ Division.

29 POST-CLOSURE CLEAN UP RESTRICTIONS. Any expenditures in excess of ~~\$50,000~~

31 appropriated in the Contractual Services line item of the Landfill Post-
32 Closure Program appropriation section, for corrective action to remedy
33 environmental impacts of closed disposal sites previously operated as a
34 landfill pursuant to state law, ~~will be prioritized and authorized~~ shall be
35 subject to review and approval by the Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology
36 Commission after addressing corrective actions needed to address

1 environmental impacts from permitted landfills closed properly. ~~Expenditures~~
2 ~~exceeding \$2,000,000 per fiscal year must be approved by the Arkansas~~
3 ~~Pollution Control and Ecology Commission.~~

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
5 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

7 SECTION 48. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. NON
9 HAZARDOUS SITE CLEAN UP RESTRICTIONS. Expenditures from the Division of
10 Environmental Quality Fee Trust Fund for the cleanup of non hazardous sites
11 which pose a threat to the environment, as appropriated in the Non Hazardous
12 Site Cleanup appropriation section, shall be funded only through interest
13 earnings from the Division of Environmental Quality Fee Trust Fund. The
14 Arkansas ~~Department~~ Division of Environmental Quality shall seek cost
15 recovery from parties responsible for damages to the environment that dictate

25 (a) The General Assembly finds that:

26 (1) A growing number of regional solid waste management districts
27 within the state are facing difficulty in funding the necessary costs of
28 ~~closure and~~ post-closure care of landfills owned by the districts; and

29 (2) Without ~~closure and~~ post-closure care of landfills,
30 irreparable harm to human health and the environment will occur.

31 (b) Notwithstanding Arkansas Code § 8-6-1001 et seq. and any Landfill
32 Post-Closure Trust Fund cleanup restrictions enumerated in this Act, the
33 Arkansas ~~Department~~ Division of Environmental Quality also may:

34 (1) Expend monies from the Landfill Post-Closure Trust Fund to a
35 state-approved contractor or the regional solid waste management district to
36 complete all actions necessary to achieve the ~~final closure and~~ post-closure

1 care of a landfill owned by a regional solid waste management district if the
2 ~~department~~ division determines that the regional solid waste management
3 district:

4 (A) Has filed for protection under federal bankruptcy law;

5 (B) Is unable to meet its debt obligations in the ordinary
6 course of its operations; or

7 (C) Is otherwise insolvent.

8 (c) This section is in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~ 2021 through June
9 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

11 SECTION 50. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

13 INVESTMENTS. All funds that are held in any trust fund administered by the
14 Arkansas ~~Department~~ Division of Environmental Quality may be invested and
15 reinvested, subject to the written approval of the Office of the Treasurer,
16 and all investments as authorized for use by the Office of the Treasurer may
17 be available to the listed funds. The movement of these funds into and out
18 of investments shall be by fund transfers as directed by the Director of the
19 Arkansas ~~Department~~ Division of Environmental Quality or the Director's

26 SERVICES.

27 (a)(1)(A) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may create paying
28 accounts on his or her books and on the books of the Treasurer of State and
29 the Auditor of State for the payment of personal services and operating
30 expenses by the Department of Energy and Environment.

31 (B) Upon prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council, or
32 if meeting in Legislative Session the Joint Budget Committee, the Chief
33 Fiscal Officer of the State shall direct the transfer of funds and
34 appropriations to the Shared Services Paying Account appropriation section of
35 this act and the transfer of positions to the Regular Salaries – Shared
36 Services appropriation section of this act on the books of the Treasurer of

1 State, the Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

2 (2) The transfer authority provided in subdivision (a)(1) of
3 this section for efficiencies and to eliminate duplication of services are
4 limited only to those services that are provided for multiple divisions of a
5 department, including without limitation to administration, human resources,
6 procurement, communications, fleet operations, and information services.

7 (3) The transfer authority provided to the department in
8 subdivision (a)(1) of this section may be used to make transfers only within
9 the department's appropriation act or between other appropriation acts
10 authorized for the department.

11 (b)(1) Each department utilizing the Shared Services Paying Account
12 section or Regular Salaries – Shared Services section of this act shall
13 submit a report to be included in the Budget Manuals for hearings, conducted
14 by the General Assembly, listing all shared services transfers of positions,
15 funds, and appropriation under this section, which shall be submitted as
16 instructed by the Department of Finance and Administration - Office of Budget
17 for uniformity.

18 (2) A report submitted under subdivision (b)(1) of this section
19 shall include the following:

20 (A) The position number, authorized position title, class
21 code, grade, business area, and name of the division, section, or unit for
22 the position being transferred to the Regular Salaries – Shared Services
23 section of this act; and

24 (B) The fund center, appropriation, appropriation amount,
25 commitment item or items, business area, and name of the division, section,
26 or unit for the fund or appropriation being transferred to the Shared
27 Services Paying Account.

28 (c)(1) It is the intent of the Ninety-Second General Assembly that the
29 authority under this section to transfer positions is intended for use for
30 the time period prior to Fiscal Year ~~2022~~ 2023 to allow cabinet-level
31 departments to establish a centralized Regular Salaries - Shared Services
32 section, with the recommendation that the position transfer authority granted
33 under this section be discontinued after that time.

34 (2) The Bureau of Legislative Research shall bring the
35 recommendation in subdivision (c)(1) of this section to the attention of the
36 chairs conducting the ~~2021~~ 2022 ~~Regular~~ Fiscal Session pre-session budget

1 hearings, the chairs of the Special Language Subcommittee, and the members of
2 the Special Language Subcommittee during pre-session budget hearings.

3 (d) Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount
4 of appropriation and general revenue funding for a cabinet-level department
5 each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually
6 accomplished by delineating the maximums in the appropriation act or acts and
7 establishing authorized positions and the general revenue allocations
8 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue
9 Stabilization Law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the
10 cabinet-level departments created under Acts 2019, No. 910, may operate more
11 efficiently if some flexibility is provided as authorized under this section.
12 Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly
13 maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or,
14 if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, as
15 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative
16 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section.
17 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
18 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
19 this entire section is void.

20 (e) The provisions of this section shall be in effect from the date of

23 SECTION 52. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
24 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
25 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
26 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
27 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
28 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
29 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
30 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
31 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

33 SECTION 53. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
34 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
35 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
36 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

1 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
2 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
3 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
4 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
5

6 SECTION 54. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
7 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
8 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
9 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of
10 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
11 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
12 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm
13 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
14 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
15 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
16 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
