- SECTION 51. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 25 SERVICES.
  - (a)(1)(A) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may create paying accounts on his or her books and on the books of the Treasurer of State and the Auditor of State for the payment of personal services and operating expenses by the Department of Energy and Environment.
- 30 (B) Upon prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council, or 31 if meeting in Legislative Session the Joint Budget Committee, the Chief 32 Fiscal Officer of the State shall direct the transfer of funds and 33 appropriations to the Shared Services Paying Account appropriation section of 34 this act and the transfer of positions to the Regular Salaries - Shared 35 Services appropriation section of this act on the books of the Treasurer of

12	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
13	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
14	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
15	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
