15 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND  
17 TRANSFER PROVISION. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State,  
18 the Arkansas ~~Department~~ Division of Environmental Quality may transfer from  
19 various department funds to the Division of Environmental Quality Fund  
20 Account the sum of \$1,500,000 in fiscal year ~~2020-2021~~ 2021-2022 for the

23 HAZARDOUS SITE CLEAN UP RESTRICTIONS. Expenditures from the Division of

7 (2) Without ~~closure and~~ post-closure care of landfills,  
8 irreparable harm to human health and the environment will occur.

9 (b) Notwithstanding Arkansas Code § 8-6-1001 et seq. and any Landfill  
10 Post-Closure Trust Fund cleanup restrictions enumerated in this Act, the  
11 Arkansas ~~Department~~ Division of Environmental Quality also may:

12 (1) Expend monies from the Landfill Post-Closure Trust Fund to a  
13 state-approved contractor or the regional solid waste management district to  
14 complete all actions necessary to achieve the ~~final closure and~~ post-closure  
15 care of a landfill owned by a regional solid waste management district if the  
16 ~~department~~ division determines that the regional solid waste management  
17 district:

18 (A) Has filed for protection under federal bankruptcy law;

19 (B) Is unable to meet its debt obligations in the ordinary

25 SECTION 51. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

27 INVESTMENTS. All funds that are held in any trust fund administered by the  
28 Arkansas ~~Department~~ Division of Environmental Quality may be invested and  
29 reinvested, subject to the written approval of the Office of the Treasurer,  
30 and all investments as authorized for use by the Office of the Treasurer may  
31 be available to the listed funds. The movement of these funds into and out

(a)(1)(A) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may create paying accounts on his or her books and on the books of the Treasurer of State and the Auditor of State for the payment of personal services and operating expenses by the Department of Energy and Environment.

(B) Upon prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council, or if meeting in Legislative Session the Joint Budget Committee, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall direct the transfer of funds and appropriations to the Shared Services Paying Account appropriation section of this act and the transfer of positions to the Regular Salaries – Shared Services appropriation section of this act on the books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

(2) The transfer authority provided in subdivision (a)(1) of this section for efficiencies and to eliminate duplication of services are limited only to those services that are provided for multiple divisions of a department, including without limitation to administration, human resources, procurement, communications, fleet operations, and information services.

(3) The transfer authority provided to the department in subdivision (a)(1) of this section may be used to make transfers only within the department's appropriation act or between other appropriation acts authorized for the department.

(b)(1) Each department utilizing the Shared Services Paying Account section or Regular Salaries – Shared Services section of this act shall submit a report to be included in the Budget Manuals for hearings, conducted by the General Assembly, listing all shared services transfers of positions, funds, and appropriation under this section, which shall be submitted as instructed by the Department of Finance and Administration - Office of Budget for uniformity.

(2) A report submitted under subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall include the following:

(A) The position number, authorized position title, class code, grade, business area, and name of the division, section, or unit for the position being transferred to the Regular Salaries – Shared Services

1 section of this act; and

2 (B) The fund center, appropriation, appropriation amount,  
3 commitment item or items, business area, and name of the division, section,  
4 or unit for the fund or appropriation being transferred to the Shared  
5 Services Paying Account.

6 (c)(1) It is the intent of the Ninety-Second General Assembly that the  
7 authority under this section to transfer positions is intended for use for  
8 the time period prior to Fiscal Year ~~2022~~ 2023 to allow cabinet-level  
9 departments to establish a centralized Regular Salaries - Shared Services  
10 section, with the recommendation that the position transfer authority granted  
11 under this section be discontinued after that time.

12 (2) The Bureau of Legislative Research shall bring the  
13 recommendation in subdivision (c)(1) of this section to the attention of the  
14 chairs conducting the ~~2021~~ 2022 ~~Regular~~ Fiscal Session pre-session budget  
15 hearings, the chairs of the Special Language Subcommittee, and the members of  
16 the Special Language Subcommittee during pre-session budget hearings.

17 (d) Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount  
18 of appropriation and general revenue funding for a cabinet-level department  
19 each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually  
20 accomplished by delineating the maximums in the appropriation act or acts and  
21 establishing authorized positions and the general revenue allocations  
22 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue  
23 Stabilization Law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the  
24 cabinet-level departments created under Acts 2019, No. 910, may operate more  
25 efficiently if some flexibility is provided as authorized under this section.  
26 Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly  
27 maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or,  
28 if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, as

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1 SECTION 53. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

5 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

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11 SECTION 54. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
12 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
13 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
14 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
15 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
16 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
17 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
18 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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20 SECTION 55. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
21 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
22 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
23 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of  
24 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
25 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
26 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm  
27 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
28 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
29 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
30 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
