- 25 that a disaster has occurred in which catastrophic losses have been suffered
- 26 by individuals or public entities in the state, or both.

- 31 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code \S 19-5-1006(b), concerning the disaster
- 32 assistance fund, is amended to read as follows:
- 33 (b) The Disaster Assistance Fund shall consist of moneys received from
- 34 the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund in such amounts as may be required to
- 35 provide state moneys for each declared emergency or major disaster as
- 36 required by the Arkansas Emergency Services Act of 1973, § 12-75-101 et seq.,

1	but not to exceed in the aggregate the sum of thirteen million two hundred
2	fifty thousand dollars (\$13,250,000) sixteen million two hundred fifty
3	thousand dollars (\$16,250,000) per fiscal year.
