28	SECTION 2. Arkan	sas Code $ 17-92-101(17)(A)(x), $	concerning the
29	definition of "practice	of pharmacy", is amended to rea	d as follows:
30		(x)(a) Providing pharmacy care	; and .
31		(b) A pharmacist may tre	at the following
32	conditions within the f	ramework of a written protocol:	
33		(1) Influenza;	
34		(2) Pharynigitis c	aused by streptococcus

1	(4) Skin conditions, such as ringworm,		
2	insect bites, and athlete's foot;		
3	(5) Cold sores;		
4	(6) Allergic rhinitis; and		
5	(7) Motion sickness.		
6	(c) A pharmacist shall only treat conditions		
7	for which the pharmacist has tested and that are approved under this		
8	subdivision $(17)(A)(x)(c)$.		
9	(d)(1) The Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy,		
10	with consultation with the Arkansas State Medical Board, shall adopt by rule		
11	a formulary of medicinal drugs that a pharmacist may prescribe for treatment		
12	of conditions approved under this subdivision $(17)(A)(x)(d)$ and an		
13	accompanying treatment protocol.		
14	(2) The formulary shall include		
15	medicinal drugs approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration		
16	which are indicated for treatment of these conditions, including without		
17	limitation any over-the-counter medication.		
18	(3) The formulary shall not include any		
19	controlled substance in Schedule I-IV or 21 U.S.C. § 812, as existing on		
20	<u>January 1, 2021.</u>		
21	(e) A pharmacist may write a prescription for		
22	over-the-counter medications, supplies, and devices to treat the conditions		
23	listed in subdivision $(17)(A)(x)(b)$ of this section; and		
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25	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 92, Subchapter 1, is		
26	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
27	17-92-118. Point-of-care treatment.		
28	A pharmacist who tests for conditions under § 17-92-101(17)(A)(x)		
29	shall:		
30	(1) Hold a license to practice pharmacy in this state;		
31	(2) Report a diagnosis or suspected existence of influenza to		
32	the Department of Health;		
33	(3) Furnish patient records to a healthcare practitioner		
34	designated by the patient upon the request of the patient; and		
35	(4) Maintain records of all patients receiving services under		
36	this section for two (2) years.		

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2	SECTION 4. DO NOT CODIFY. Effective date.
3	This act takes effect on and after January 1, 2022.
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
