31	Life Photograph Act".	
32	(b)(1) In a homicide case, the deceased person and the deceased	
33	person's family have a right to have a photograph depicting the deceased	
34	person as he or she appeared in life before the crime occurred admitted and	
35	displayed at trial during the state's case-in-chief, if the photograph is	
36	submitted by the prosecution and is a reasonable, accurate, and appropriate
