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2	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 26-35-501(a)(1), concerning the time to pay		
3	property tax and the timeline for making installment payments of property		
4	tax, is amended to read as follows:		
5	(a)(1)(A) All Except as provided in subdivision (a)(1)(B) of this		
6	section, all ad valorem taxes levied on real and personal property by the		
7	several county courts of the state when assembled for the purpose of levying		
8	taxes, except taxes on the property of utilities and carriers and all ad		
9	valorem taxes on real property held in escrow, are due and payable between		
10	the first business day in March and October 15 inclusive in the year		
11	succeeding the year in which the levy is made.		
12	(B) A county collector may open the tax books for payment		
13	of ad valorem taxes before the first business day in March if:		
14	(i) The tax books have been delivered; and		
15	(ii) The real and personal property taxes have been		
16	certified for collection.		
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18	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 26-35-501(a)(2)(A)(i), concerning the time		
19	to pay property tax and the timeline for making installment payments of		
20	property tax, is amended to read as follows:		
21	(i) The first installment of one-fourth $(\frac{1}{4})$ of the		
22	amount of the taxes is payable between the first business day in March or, if		
23	the county collector opens the tax books early under subdivision (a)(1)(B) of		
24	this section, the date the county collector opens the tax books, and the		
25	third Monday in April inclusive;		
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27	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 26-36-201(a)(1), concerning the dates that		
28	property taxes are due and payable, is amended to read as follows:		
29	(a)(1)(A) All Except as provided in subdivision (a)(1)(B) of this		
30	section, all taxes levied on real estate and personal property for the coun		
31	courts of this state, when assembled for the purpose of levying taxes, are		
32	due and payable at the county collector's office between the first business		
33	day of March and October 15 inclusive.		
34	(B) A county collector may open the tax books for payment		
35	of taxes before the first business day in March if:		
36	(i) The tax books have been delivered; and		

1	(ii) The real and personal property taxes have been		
2	certified for collection.		
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4	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
5	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that local governments have		
6	suffered a fiscal decline as a result of the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19)		
7	pandemic; that the negative effect the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic		
8	has had on local governments' revenue has impacted local governments' ability		
9	to provide important services to maintain public peace and safety; and that		
10	this act is immediately necessary to allow county collectors to collect taxes		
11	earlier to assist local governments in obtaining the revenue necessary to		
12	continuing providing important services to maintain public peace and safety.		
13	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately		
14	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
15	become effective on:		
16	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
17	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
18	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
19	bill; or		
20	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
21	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
