9 OVERPAYMENTS BY THE ARKANSAS PUBLIC EMPLOYEES'

11 "CLAIMANT AGENCY"; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR

15 CONCERNING THE COLLECTION OF DEBTS AND

19 TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.
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23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 26-36-303(1)(A), concerning the definition
26 of "claimant agency" as applicable to setoffs against state tax refunds, is
27 amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

28 (xxi) Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System.
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30 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
31 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Public Employees'
32 Retirement System holds system funds in trust for the benefit of all members;
33 that the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement
34 System has a fiduciary duty to manage funds held in trust by the system,
35 including the recoupment of debts to the system; that the law does not allow
36 the system to waive debts or overpayments; that the system expends time and



1 effort in the recoupment of debts and overpayment; that unrecovered debts or
2 overpayments are ultimately borne by members of the system; that the system
3 currently has recorded debts or overpayments that are in immediate need of
4 collection; that time is of the essence in collecting debts or overpayments;
5 that this act is of great importance to members of the system and to other
6 citizens of this state in general; and that this act is immediately necessary
7 in order to protect and maintain an orderly system of accounting for the
8 members of the system. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this
9 act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
10 health, and safety shall become effective on:

11 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

12 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
13 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
14 bill; or

15 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
16 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

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
