7	allowed to be executed with the understanding that the notarial certificate
8	will be completed or attached to a document outside of the physical presence
9	of the notary public if the notary public is present via real-time audio and
10	visual means.
11	(C) As used in this subdivision (f)(2):
12	(i) "Notary public" means a notary public who is:
13	(a) An attorney licensed by the State of

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1	(A) An attorney licensed by the State of Arkansas;
2	(B) A title agent licensed by the State of Arkansas;
3	(C) Supervised by either an attorney or a title agent
4	licensed by the State of Arkansas; or
5	(D) Employed by a:
6	(i) Nonbank financial institution licensed or
7	registered by the State Securities Department; or
8	(ii) Bank, savings and loan association, or state or
9	federal credit union with federal depository insurance;
10	(2)(A) "Real-time audio and visual means" means technology by
11	which all parties can see and hear the other parties simultaneously.
12	(B) "Real-time audio and visual means" includes without
13	limitation videoconference technology; and
14	(3) "Videoconference technology" means Skype, Zoom, FaceTime,
15	and other similar technologies.
16	(b)(l) A notary public may notarize signatures, including
17	acknowledgments and jurats, virtually through real-time audio and visual
18	means, provided that the notary public is physically located in the State of
19	Arkansas at the time of signing and the signing of documents is visually seen
20	by the person who confirms it.
21	(2)(A) An individual who:
22	(i) Witnesses a document through real-time audio and
23	visual means may be considered an in-person witness if the presence and
24	identity of the witnesses are validated at the time of signing by a notary
25	public; or
26	(ii) Signs a document through real-time audio and
27	visual means may be considered in the presence of an in-person witness if the
28	presence and identity of the witnesses are validated at the time of signing
29	by a notary public.
30	(B) The identity and physical presence of witnesses and
31	signers in this state shall be validated at the time of execution of the
32	documents to be witnessed.
33	(3)(A) If two (2) or more individuals sign a document
34	simultaneously in different locations, the individuals shall necessarily sign
35	separate signature pages, and all documents executed under this section shall
36	be executed in counterparts.

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1	(B) Absent an express prohibition in a document against
2	signing in counterparts, all legal documents, including without limitation
3	deeds, last wills and testaments, durable powers of attorney, and healthcare
4	proxies, may be signed in counterparts.
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6	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 21-14-202 is amended to read as follows:
7	21-14-202. Use of facsimile signatures and seals authorized — Filing
8	required <u>— Definition</u> .
9	(a) Any Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a notary
10	public may affix a notary certificate bearing the notary public's facsimile
11	signature and facsimile seal in lieu of the notary public's manual signature
12	and rubber or embossed seal in blue or black ink on a commercial document,
13	after filing with the Secretary of State:
14	(1) The notary public's manual signature certified by the notary
15	public under oath;
16	(2) A general description of the types of commercial documents
17	to be notarized by facsimile signature and seal;
18	(3) The name and manual signature of any other person or persons
19	signing the commercial documents by manual or facsimile signature; and
20	(4) The written consent of any other person or persons signing
21	the commercial documents to the use of the notary public's facsimile
22	signature and facsimile seal on the commercial documents.
23	(b)(1) A notary public does not have to file with the Secretary of
24	State his or her signatures, general descriptions of potential commercial
25	documents to be notarized via facsimile signature, the names of persons

28	<u>be best notarized via facsimile signature.</u>
29	(2) As used in this subsection, "notary public" means a notary

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5	SECTION 4. DO NOT CODIFY. RETROACTIVITY. This act is retroactive to
6	March 30, 2020.
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8	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
9	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the risk of exposure to
10	coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) or to severe acute respiratory syndrome
11	<u>coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) or any of its mutations is causing delays in</u>
12	conducting business and satisfying requirements for notarization and signing
13	of certain documents due to the inability to hold in-person meetings; that a
14	need exists to allow for remote witnessing of certain documents; and that
15	this act is immediately necessary because businesses in Arkansas will suffer
16	and the question as to the legal effectiveness of signatures during a
17	disaster emergency can result in confusion and uncertainty and it is the
18	intent of the General Assembly that this act be retroactive to prevent
19	further harm to businesses and citizens. Therefore, an emergency is declared
20	to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of
21	the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
22	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
23	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
24	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
25	<u>bill; or</u>
26	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
27	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
