4	(1) "Home-based work" means any occupation performed or business	
5	conducted by a resident within a residence;	
6	(2) "Legislative body" means the quorum court of a county or the	
7	council, board of directors, board of commissioners, or similar elected	
8	governing body of local government;	
9	(3) "Local government" means a city of the first class, a city	
10	of the second class, or an incorporated town;	
11	(4) "Ordinance" means an ordinance, resolution, or other	
12	appropriate legislative enactment of a legislative body that prohibits or	
13	requires an individual to obtain approval from a local government before	
14	operating a home-based business from a residence or performing home-based	
15	work, including without limitation home occupation permits and licenses; and	
16	(5) "Residence" means a permanent dwelling place, unit, or an	
17	accessory structure.	
18	(d) Notwithstanding any other law, local government may establish an	
19	ordinance concerning home-based work only if the ordinance is necessary to:	
20	(1) Ensure the premises does not exhibit advertisements or	
21	similar exterior evidence that a residence is being used for any purpose	
22	other than a residence;	
23	(2) Ensure home-based work does not cause an odor, excessive	
24	dust, smoke, vibration, noise, heat glare, or similar interference;	
25	(3) Ensure the residence is in compliance with health and safety	
26	<u>codes;</u>	
27	(4) Enforce traffic and building codes; or	
28	(5) Prohibit or limit the use of home-based work for the	
29	purposes of protecting the public health, safety, and welfare and to prevent	
30	criminal activity, including without limitation selling illegal drugs,	
31	liquor, or pornography, or operating an adult-oriented business, animal	
32	boarding center, sober living home, or automotive repair center.	
33	(e) This section does not supersede:	
34	(1) An agreement between a homeowners' association and a	
35	homeowner; or	
36	(2) Any valid deed restrictions.

1	(f) If a local government takes enforcement action against an
2	individual for violating an ordinance, then the local government shall
3	demonstrate that the ordinance is consistent with subsection (d) of this
4	section.
