9	AN ACT CONCERNING SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS; TO
10	REQUIRE THAT A SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND

19	TO REQUIRE A SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF
20	DIRECTORS AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT

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27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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29	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-10-128, concerning school resource
30	officers, is amended to add additional subsections to read as follows:
31	(c)(l) A school district board of directors that accepts a school
32	resource officer shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the
33	local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction, or adopt policies and
34	procedures if the school district has an institutional law enforcement
35	officer as described by § 6-13-1701 et seq., that governs the school resource
36	officer and includes without limitation:



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1	(A) The financial responsibilities of each party;
2	(B) The chain of command;
3	(C) The process for the selection of school resource
4	officers;
5	(D) The process for the evaluation of school resource
6	officers;
7	(E) The training requirements for school resource
8	officers; and
9	(F) The roles and responsibilities of school resource
10	officers, which shall include without limitation:
11	(i) Clarification of the school resource officer's
12	<u>involvement in student discipline;</u>
13	(ii) The use of physical restraints or chemical
14	sprays;
15	(iii) The use of firearms; and
16	(iv) Making arrests on the public school campus.
17	(2) The memorandum of understanding required under subdivision
18	(c)(l) of this section shall be based on a model memorandum created by the
19	Division of Elementary and Secondary Education and the Arkansas Center for
20	School Safety, which shall include without limitation the requirements listed
21	in subdivision (c)(l) of this section.
22	(3) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall
23	promulgate rules specifying how the adoption of a memorandum of understanding
24	or policies and procedures shall be verified.
25	(d)(1) Sworn, nonsupervisory law enforcement personnel, including
26	without limitation school resource officers, who are assigned to a public
27	school campus during the instructional day or employed by a public school
28	district shall:
29	(A) Within eighteen (18) months of being assigned or
30	employed by the public school district:
31	(i)(a) Complete a forty-hour basic school resource
32	officer training program developed and provided, or approved, by the Arkansas
33	Center for School Safety.
34	(b) The training required under subdivision
35	(d)(l)(A)(i)(a) of this section shall include without limitation:
36	(1) The roles and responsibilities of

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1	school resource officers in public schools;
2	(2) Laws that are specific to public
3	schools and students in public schools; and
4	(3) Adolescent behavior and development;
5	and
6	(ii)(a) Obtain certification in Youth Mental Health
7	<u>First Aid.</u>
8	(b) Youth Mental Health First Aid
9	certification shall be maintained and renewed every four (4) years if the
10	school resource officer remains assigned to or employed by a public school
11	district;
12	(B)(i) Within five (5) years after receiving the initial
13	basic school resource officer training program, complete a sixteen-hour
14	school resource officer refresher training developed and provided, or
15	approved, by the Arkansas Center for School Safety.
16	(ii) The school resource officer refresher training
17	required under subdivision (d)(l)(B)(i) of this section shall be completed
18	every five (5) years; and
19	(C)(i) Annually complete twelve (12) hours of public
20	school-specific continuing education developed and provided, or approved, by
21	the Arkansas Center for School Safety.
22	(ii) The Youth Mental Health First Aid training
23	required under subdivision (d)(l)(A)(ii) of this section and the school
24	resource officer refresher training required under subdivision (d)(l)(B) of
25	this section shall count towards the twelve (12) hours of public school-
26	specific continuing education required under subdivision (d)(l)(C)(i) of this
27	section in the years during which the Youth Mental Health First Aid and
28	school resource officer refresher trainings are completed.
29	(2) A school resource officer who is assigned by a public school
30	for only extracurricular activities is exempt from the training requirements
31	under subdivision (d)(1) of this section.
32	(e)(l) A public school district superintendent and public school
33	principal who accept a school resource officer or employ an institutional
34	officer as defined by § 6-13-1701 shall complete a one-hour school resource
35	officer roles and responsibilities training developed and provided, or
36	approved, by the Arkansas Center for School Safety within nine (9) months of

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accepting or employing the school resource officer. (2) Public school district personnel directly responsible for supervising a school resource officer shall complete a one-hour school resource officer roles and responsibilities training developed and provided, or approved, by the Arkansas Center for School Safety within one (1) year of accepting or employing the school resource officer and every two (2) years thereafter. (3) Training received by a licensed educator under subdivisions (e)(1) and (2) of this section may count towards the professional development required for renewal of an educator's license by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education Rules Governing Professional Development. (f)(1) The Arkansas Center for School Safety shall monitor compliance with the continuing education and training requirements under this section. (2) A school resource officer who fails to complete any training required under this section shall be unable to serve as a school resource officer until the training required under this section is complete. (3) A school resource officer shall not be assigned to a public school district or a public school in which the public school district superintendent or public school principal have not completed the training required under this section.
