26	habitual offender sentence enhancement, is amended to add an additional

30	previously convicted of a felony for possession of a controlled substance			
31	under § 5-64-101 et seq., and the defendant also was convicted of a felony			
32	for possession of drug paraphernalia under § 5-64-443 stemming from the same			
33	set of facts, the two	(2) felonies shall be considered as o	one (1) felony.

1 (a) A person who possesses drug paraphernalia with the purpose to use 2 the drug paraphernalia to inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance or to store, contain, conceal, or weigh 3 4 a controlled substance in violation of this chapter upon conviction is guilty 5 of: 6 (1) A Class A misdemeanor; or 7 (2) A Class D felony if the controlled: 8 (A) Controlled substance is methamphetamine, heroin, 9 fentanyl, or cocaine; and (B) Person has been previously convicted of a violation of 10 11 this chapter. 12 (b) A person who uses or possesses with the purpose to use drug 13 paraphernalia to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, 14 compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, or repack 15 a controlled substance that is methamphetamine, heroin, fentanyl, or cocaine 16 in violation of this chapter upon conviction is guilty of a: 17 (1) Class D felony; or 18 (2) Class B felony if the controlled substance is 19 methamphetamine, heroin, fentanyl, or cocaine. 20 (c) A person who uses or possesses with the purpose to use drug paraphernalia to store, contain, or conceal a controlled substance that is 21 22 methamphetamine, heroin, fentanyl, or cocaine upon conviction is guilty of a 23 Class D felony When the same conduct of a defendant may establish the 24 commission of more than one (1) offense under this section, the defendant may 25 only be convicted of one (1) offense under this section. 26 (d) A person who uses or possesses with the purpose to use drug 27 paraphernalia to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, 28 compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, or repack 29 a controlled substance that is not methamphetamine, heroin, fentanyl, or 30 cocaine upon conviction is guilty of a Class D felony. 31 (c) A person who uses or possesses with the purpose to use drug 32 paraphernalia to store, contain, or conceal a controlled substance that is 33 not methamphetamine, heroin, fentanyl, or cocaine upon conviction is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor. 34 35 36
