26	This subchapter	shall be known and may be cited	as the "Personal
27	<u>Delivery Device Act".</u>

29	27-51-2102. Def:		
30	As used in this s		
31		ible entity" means a corporation

2	(i) Manufactured for the transport of cargo and		
3	goods;		
4	(ii) That weighs five hundred pounds (500 lbs.) or		
5	less;		
6	(iii) Equipped with automated driving technology,		
7	including hardware and software, that enables the operation of the personal		
8	delivery device with or without the active control or monitoring of a person		
9	<u>and</u>		
10	(iv) Equipped with a braking system that enables the		
11	personal delivery device to come to a controlled stop.		
12	(B) "Personal delivery device" does not include:		
13	(i) A motor vehicle under § 27-49-114; or		
14	(ii) An autonomous vehicle under § 27-51-2001; and		
15	(4)(A) "Personal delivery device operator" means an employee or		
16	agent of an eligible entity who exercises active physical control over, or		
17	monitoring of, the navigation and operation of a personal delivery device.		
18	(B) "Personal delivery device operator" does not include:		
19	(i) With respect to a delivery or other service		
20	rendered by a personal delivery device, the person who requests the delivery		
21	or service; or		
22	(ii) A person who only arranges for and dispatches a		
23	personal delivery device for a delivery or other service.		
24			
25	27-51-2103. Operation of a personal delivery device.		
26	(a) A personal delivery device may be operated at a maximum speed of:		
27	(1) Ten miles per hour (10 m.p.h.) when operated in a pedestrian		
28	area; or		
29	(2) Twenty miles per hour (20 m.p.h.) when operated on a:		
30	(A) County street or road; or		
31	(B) Municipal street or road.		
32	(b) A personal delivery device may not be operated:		
33	<u>(1) On:</u>		
34	(A) An interstate highway;		
35	(B) A controlled access highway;		
36	(C) A state highway; or		

1	(D) A street or road where a posted speed limit is more			
2	than forty-five miles per hour (45 m.p.h.); or			
3	(2) In a manner that:			
4	(A) Unreasonably interferes with motor vehicles or			
5	traffic; or			
6	(B) Blocks a public right-of-way.			
7	(c) If a personal delivery device is operated between sunset and			
8	sunrise, the personal delivery device shall be equipped with a lighted lamp			
9	on both the front and rear of the personal delivery device that is visible:			
10	(1) On all sides of the personal delivery device in clear			
11	weather from a distance of at least five hundred feet (500 ft.); and			
12	(2) From the front and rear of the personal delivery device when			
13	directly in front of low beams of headlights on a motor vehicle.			
14				
15	27-51-2104. Operation on a street or road.			
16	A personal delivery device operated on a street or road shall be			
17	operated:			
18	(1) As close as practicable to the outside edge of a street or			
19	road; and			
20	(2) In the direction of authorized traffic movement.			
21				
22	27-51-2105. Rules in pedestrian area.			
23	A personal delivery device has the rights and obligations applicable to			
24	a pedestrian under § 27-51-1201 et seq. except that a personal delivery			
25	device shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian.			
26				
27	27-51-2106. Personal delivery device operator.			
28	A personal delivery device operator shall operate a personal delivery			
29	device in a manner that ensures the personal delivery device:			
30	(1) Complies with traffic or pedestrian control devices and			
31	signals; and			
32	(2) Does not unreasonably interfere with pedestrians or traffic.			
33				
34	27-51-2107. Unique identifying number.			
35	An eligible entity shall equip each personal delivery device with a:			
36	(1) Marker that clearly identifies the name and contact of the			

T	eligible entity responsible for the operation of the personal delivery	
2	device; and	
3	(2) Unique identifying number.	
4		
5	27-51-2108. Insurance Requirement.	
6	An eligible entity shall maintain an insurance policy for each personal	
7	delivery device that includes general liability coverage of not less than one	
8	hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for damages arising from the operation of	
9	a personal delivery device by the eligible entity or personal delivery device	
10	operator.	
11		
12	27-51-2109. Licensing and registration.	
13	A personal delivery device is exempt from the licensing and	
14	registration requirements under § 27-14-601 et seq.	
15		
16	27-51-2110. Restriction on transport.	
17	An eligible entity may not use a personal delivery device to transport	
18	hazardous material that is:	
19	(1) Regulated under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act,	
20	49 U.S.C. § 5101 et seq., as it existed on January 1, 2021; and	
21	(2) Required to be placarded under 49 C.F.R. Part 172.	
22		
23	27-51-2111. Local ordinances.	
24	(a) A county or municipality may pass an ordinance to prohibit the	
25	operation of a personal delivery device upon any pedestrian area, street, or	
26	road within its jurisdiction.	
27	(b) A county or municipality shall not pass an ordinance relating to	
28	the:	
29	(1) Design, manufacture, maintenance, certification, licensing,	
30	registration, taxation, assessment, or insurance requirement of a personal	
31	delivery device; or	
32	(2) The types of cargo and goods that may be transported by a	
33	personal delivery device.
