30	(2)(A) Permit students in grades seven through twelve (7-12) in-

(2)(3) Require schools to include as part of the annual report to parents and the community the amounts and specific sources of funds received and expenditures made from competitive food and beverage contracts; (3)(4) Beginning with kindergarten and then in even-numbered grades, require schools to include as a part of a student health report to parents a body mass index percentile by age for each student; and (4)(A)(5)(A) Permit any parent to refuse to have his or her child's body mass index percentile for age assessed and reported, by providing a written refusal to the school. (B) Students in grades eleven (11) and twelve (12) are exempt from any policy or requirement of a public school or the state for measuring or reporting body mass index.
