15	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-82-2004(a), concerning prioritization of		
16	planning grants by the Graduate Medical Education Residency Expansion Board,		
17	is amended to read as follows:		
18	(a) If the Graduate Medical Education Residency Expansion Board		
19	determines that the number of first-year residency positions proposed by		
20	eligible applicants under § 6-82-2003 exceeds the amount of funding		
21	appropriated for the planning grants under this subchapter, the board:		
22	(1) May give priority for up to fifty percent (50%) of the		
23	funded first-year residency positions to be in primary care or other critical		
24	shortage areas in this state:		
25	(A) Primary care; or		
26	(B) A field in which this state has less than eighty		
27	percent (80%) of the national average of physicians per one hundred thousand		
28	(100,000) people, as determined by the board; and		
29	(2) Shall not reduce planning grant amounts awarded for each		
30	resident position, but may proportionately reduce the number of positions		
31	funded for each graduate medical education program.		
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
