30	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
31	<u>General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the General Assembly is</u>		
32	responsible for establishing the four (4) United States Congressional		
33	Districts in the state; that the United States Congressional Districts are		
34	based on the information provided by the federal decennial census by the		
35	United States Bureau of the Census; that the federal decennial census data		
36	delivery was delayed; that the establishment of the four (4) United States		

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1	Congressional Districts is necessary to provide equal representation of the			
2	citizens of Arkansas in the United States Congress; and that this act is			
3	immediately necessary because the establishment of the four (4) United States			
4	Congressional Districts must occur in adequate time for the candidates to			
5	file for office and for the citizens of Arkansas to have a fair election.			
6	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately			
7	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall			
8	become effective on:			
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
11	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
12	<u>bill; or</u>			
13	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
14	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.			
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
