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22	WHEREAS, Fayetteville School District No. 1 of Washington County,
23	Arkansas, also known as the "District", was the first public school district
24	chartered in the State of Arkansas in 1871; and
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26	WHEREAS, the first meeting of the Fayetteville Board of Education was
27	held on March 20, 1871; and
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29	WHEREAS, throughout the one-hundred-fifty-year history of Fayetteville
30	Public Schools, the District has consistently set high standards for
31	excellence, inclusion, and innovation; and
32	IHIEDEAC in 1021 I consiste Elementary Cabal in Ecoatronilla bassas aba
33	WHEREAS, in 1921, Leverett Elementary School in Fayetteville became the
34	first school in Arkansas to become a member of the National Congress of
35 36	Mothers, later known as the "National PTA"; and
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1	WHEREAS, the District has a long-standing commitment to equity and
2	equality for all, including the Fayetteville School Board's decision on May
3	21, 1954, to voluntarily begin integrating the District's schools, just four
4	(4) days after the landmark opinion of Brown v. Board of Education was issued
5	by the United States Supreme Court; and
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7	WHEREAS, the District opened Uptown School in 1972 to serve students
8	who were in danger of dropping out of school, and it was the longest
9	continually operating alternative school in Arkansas; and
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11	WHEREAS, Fayetteville Public Schools administrator Henrietta Holcomb
12	and state representative Hugh Kincaid led the push for kindergarten in
13	Arkansas public schools during the 1975 legislative session; and
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15	WHEREAS, a group of teachers in the District wrote an Arkansas history
16	curriculum for students in grade four (4) in 1984 since an Arkansas history
17	curriculum did not exist at the time, and school districts around the state
18	requested copies of the Arkansas history curriculum; and
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20	WHEREAS, established in 1983, the Fayetteville Public Schools Gifted
21	and Talented education program became the standard for gifted and talented
22	programs in Arkansas and has been recognized as the state's top gifted and
23	talented program a record seven (7) times; and
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25	WHEREAS, the District opened Fayetteville Virtual Academy in 2016,
26	which was the first district charter conversion online public school in
27	Arkansas; and
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29	WHEREAS, the District continues to live up to its mission to
30	personalize learning and exceed expectations every day in an inclusive and
31	safe environment; and
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33	WHEREAS, the District upholds the vision to be the trusted leader in
34	Arkansas public education, ensuring every student achieves his or her full
35	potential,
