1 (a) Arkansas Constitution, Article 2, § 27, permits slavery and 2 involuntary servitude as a punishment for crime. (b) As the Arkansas Constitution is the moral and legal foundation of 3 4 our state, abolishing all forms of slavery in the Arkansas Constitution 5 represents the fundamental values held by the citizens of Arkansas. 6 (c) If a prisoner is working, he or she should be compensated for that 7 labor with money or "good time" to aid his or her re-entry into society. 8 (d) The intent of this amendment is to repeal the portion of Arkansas 9 Constitution, Article 2, § 27, allowing slavery and involuntary servitude as a punishment for crime to fully abolish slavery in the State of Arkansas and 10 11 recognize the moral and economic benefits that will result from ending this 12 practice. 13 14 SECTION 2. Arkansas Constitution, Article 2, § 27, is amended to read 15 as follows: 16 § 27. Slavery - Standing armies - Military subordinate to civil power. 17 There shall be no slavery in this State, nor involuntary servitude, 18 except as a punishment for crime. No standing army shall be kept in time of 19 peace; the military shall, at all times, be in strict subordination to the 20 civil power; and no soldier shall be quartered in any house, or on any 21 premises, without the consent of the owner, in time of peace; nor in time of 22 war, except in a manner prescribed by law. 23 24 SECTION 3.
