(a) As used in this section, "Arkansas Works Program" means the Arkansas Works Program established under the Identical Acts 2016 (2nd Ex. Sess.), Nos. 1 and A Arkansas Code § 23-61-1001 et seq.

(b)(1) Determining the maximum number of employees, the maximum amount
 of appropriation, for what purposes an appropriation is authorized, and
 general revenue funding for a publicly supported institution of higher

Full-time staff and ten (10) extra help positions 17 at Northwest Technical Institute, may be paid up to seventy-five dollars 18 (\$75) per clock hour for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 2022, for 19 noncredit teaching assignments; or up to five hundred fifty dollars (\$550) 20 per semester hour for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 2022, for teaching 21 courses beyond the defined teaching load; and the employee's maximum 22 allowable salary may be exceeded by such amount; provided, however, that such 23 additional teaching load may not exceed one hundred fifty (150) clock hours 24 or nine (9) semester credit hours per school year. SECTION 51. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. SECTION 52. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
