 32 EMERGENCY GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that
 33 suffers an emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion
 34 of campus operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance
 35 through the Arkansas Department of Education - Division of Higher

28 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHE -
30 ARKANSAS WORKS AND ARKANSAS HEALTH INSURANCE MARKETPLACE RESTRICTIONS. (a)
31 As used in this section, "Arkansas Works Program" means the Arkansas Works
32 Program established under the Identical Acts 2016 (2nd Ex. Sess.), Nos. 1 and
33 2, Arkansas Code § 23-61-1001 et seq.

34 (b)(1) Determining the maximum number of employees, the maximum amount
35 of appropriation, for what purposes an appropriation is authorized, and
36 general revenue funding for a publicly supported institution of higher

1 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly.

2 (2) The purposes of subdivision (b)(1) of this section are
3 typically accomplished by:

4 (A) Identifying the purpose in the appropriation act;

5 (B) Delineating such maximums in the appropriation act for
6 a publicly supported institution of higher education; and

7 (C) Delineating the general revenue allocations authorized
8 for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization Law,
9 Arkansas Code § 19-5-101 et seq.

10 (3) It is both necessary and appropriate that the General
11 Assembly restrict the use of appropriations authorized in the acts of
12 publicly supported institutions of higher education.

13 (c)(1) Except as provided in this subsection, the publicly supported
14 institutions of higher education shall not allocate, budget, expend, or
15 utilize any appropriation authorized by the General Assembly for the purpose
16 of advertisement, promotion, or other activities designed to promote or
17 encourage enrollment in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace or the
18 Arkansas Works Program, including without limitation:

19 (A) Unsolicited communications mailed to potential
20 recipients;

21 (B) Television, radio, or online commercials;

22 (C) Billboard or mobile billboard advertising;

10 (e)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(2) of this section, the
11 publicly supported institutions of higher education shall not:

12 (A)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(1)(A)(ii) of
13 this section, allocate, budget, expend, or utilize an appropriation
14 authorized by the General Assembly for the purpose of funding activities of
15 navigators, guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed
16 producers under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide,
17 and Certified Application Counselors Act, Arkansas Code § 23-64-601 et seq.

18 (ii) Subdivision (e)(1)(A)(i) of this section does
19 not apply to regulatory and training responsibilities related to navigators,
20 guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed producers;
21 and

22 (B) Apply for or accept any funds, including without
23 limitation federal funds, for the purpose of funding activities of
24 navigators, guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed
25 producers under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide,
26 and Certified Application Counselors Act, Arkansas Code § 23-64-601 et seq.

27 (2) Subdivision (e)(1) of this section does not apply to
28 certified application counselors at health related institutions, including
29 without limitation the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

30 (f) An appropriation authorized by the General Assembly shall not be
31 subject to the provisions allowed through reallocation of resources or
32 transfer of appropriation authority for the purpose of transferring an
33 appropriation to any other appropriation authorized for publicly supported
34 institutions of higher education to be allocated, budgeted, expended, or
35 utilized in a manner prohibited by this section.

11 (1)(A) An Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship account in an
12 amount necessary to fund scholarship awards for nontraditional students for
13 the 2017-2018 academic year that were not funded due to the limitation on the
14 scholarship award amount for nontraditional students under § 6-85-
15 212(e)(2)(A) as it existed before the effective date of this act.

16 (B) The department may distribute scholarship awards to
17 nontraditional students for the 2017-2018 academic year from funds
18 transferred under subdivision (1)(A) of this section; and

19 (2)(A) The Office of the Arkansas Lottery in an amount not to
20 exceed the amount required to fund scholarship awards to be distributed under

35 STATEWIDE SCHOLARSHIP AND GRANT PROMOTION. Of the general revenue that is
36 received by and distributed from the Higher Education Grants Fund Account,

1 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer two hundred ninety-five
2 thousand dollars (\$295,000) to the Division of Higher Education Fund Account
3 to be allocated, budgeted, committed and distributed to the Statewide

16 ADDITIONAL TEACHING LOAD. Full-time staff and ten (10) extra help positions
17 at Northwest Technical Institute, may be paid up to seventy-five dollars

19 noncredit teaching assignments; or up to five hundred fifty dollars (\$550)

7 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
8 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
9 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
10 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
11 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

13 SECTION 52. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
14 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
15 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
16 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of
17 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
18 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
19 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm
20 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
21 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
22 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
23 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
