- (b) To the extent possible, the Arkansas Higher Education Performance Reporting System will utilize information from an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education's assessment outcomes measures, which are required for reaffirmation of accreditation, federal Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System report data, and data collected annually through the Statewide Information System of the Division of Higher Education.
- (c) In developing the Arkansas Higher Education Performance Reporting System, the Division of Higher Education will review and analyze higher education performance reporting systems used in other states to incorporate the best aspects of those plans.
- (d) The Arkansas Higher Education Performance Reporting System will provide the General Assembly and the public with quantitative, objective information which will reveal institutional weaknesses and strengths.

 Performance-based reports shall be provided annually to the House Committee on Education, the Senate Committee on Education, and the Legislative Council.
- (e) To the extent possible, and taking into account the differences in institutional missions, the Arkansas Higher Education Performance Reporting System will contain uniform accountability elements which reveal trends, strengths, and weaknesses and assist policymakers and prospective students and their parents in comparing institutions and judging the extent to which they are effectively and efficiently accomplishing their missions.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-61-221(b), concerning reporting of graduates requiring postsecondary remediation, is amended to read as follows:

- (b) The Division of Higher Education and the Office of Accountability

 <u>Division of Public School Accountability</u>, shall work together to develop a compatible system of reporting the number of:
- 31 (1) Students who required remediation during their first year of 32 enrollment in a state-supported institution of higher education if the 33 enrollment occurred within two (2) years of graduation from a secondary 34 school in this state;
 - (2) Students who required remediation and who graduated:
 - (A) With a 3.0 or higher grade point average on a 4.0

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11	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-82-306(b)(4)-(6), concerning eligibility		
12	for the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program, are amended to read as follows:		
13	(4) Graduates from a high school; and		
14	(5)(A) Demonstrates proficiency in the application of knowledge		
15	and skills in reading and writing literacy and mathematics by passing the		
16	end-of-course examination as may be developed by the Division of Elementary		
17	and Secondary Education and as may be designated by the Division of Higher		
18	Education for this purpose.		
19	(B) "End-of-course" assessment means those assessments		
20	defined in § 6-15-419 [repealed]; and		
21	(6)(A)(5)(A) Satisfies the qualifications of superior academic		
22	ability as established by the Division of Higher Education with criteria
