- 1 Assembly is in Regular Session and nine (9) Legislative Liaisons who shall
- 2 serve without pay but shall each be entitled to per diem of up to two hundred
- 3 dollars (\$200) for each day the General Assembly is in Regular Session. After
- 4 receiving approval of the Governor, the Department of Finance and
- 5 Administration Management Services Division is hereby authorized to process
- 6 payments to said Liaisons from funds authorized by this Act.

8 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PAYMENT

10 OF PER DIEM. Per Diem as authorized in Section 2 - Liaisons Authorized of

11 this Act shall be in effect from and after January 11, 2021.

SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this

2	Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its		
3	passage and approval could work irreparable harm upon the proper		
4	administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,		
5	an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the		
6	immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in		
7	full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. If		
8	the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become		
9	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor		
10	may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
11	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last chamber overrides		
12	the veto.
