6	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(a)(3)(A), concerning school		
7	funding, is amended to read as follows:		
8	(3)(A) A school district that has experienced a decline in		
9	average daily membership over the two (2) immediately preceding school years		
10	shall receive:		
11	(i) Declining enrollment funding equal to:		
12	(a) For the 2021-2022 school year, the		
13	difference between the $\underline{2019-2020}$ and $\underline{2020-2021}$ school average of the two (2)		
14	immediately preceding years' average daily memberships and the average daily		
15	membership for the previous school year multiplied by the amount of		
16	foundation funding $\frac{\text{set forth}}{\text{provided}}$ in subdivision (a)(2) of this section:		
17	<u>and</u>		
18	(b) For the 2022-2023 school year and each		
19	following school year, the difference between the average of the two (2)		
20	immediately preceding years' average daily memberships and the average daily		
21	membership for the previous school year multiplied by the amount of		
22	foundation funding provided in subdivision (a)(2) of this section; or		
23	(ii) Special needs isolated funding under § 6-20-		
24	604.

26	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
27	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-		
28	19) pandemic has resulted in a substantial disruption to the traditional		
29	educational environment and system in the state's kindergarten through grade		
30	twelve (K-12) public schools and open-enrollment public charter schools; that		
31	amendments to the law as provided in this act are needed to immediately		
32	address funding shortages and other issues that public schools and open-		
33	enrollment public charter schools may face as a result of the substantial		
34	disruption caused by the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic; and that this		
35	act is immediately necessary to maintain the orderly operation of public		
36	schools and open-enrollment public charter schools so that students in this		

1	state continue to receive an adequate education. Inerefore, an emergency is		
2	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the		
3	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
4	on:		
5	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
6	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
7	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
8	bill; or		
9	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
10	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
