23	(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the initial fili	ng fees,
24	permit fees, and licensing fees associated with the formation of a b	<u>usiness</u>
25	in this state shall be waived for applicants who meet the requiremen	ts in the
26	Workforce Expansion Act of 2021, § 17-4-101 et seq.	
27	(b) Appropriate state entities shall:	
28	(1) Publish notice of the fee waiver on:	
29	(A) The website maintained by the appropriate sta	<u>te</u>

1	<u>Chapter 4 — Workforce Expansion Act of 2021</u>
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3	17-4-101. Title.
4	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Workforce
5	Expansion Act of 2021".
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7	17-4-102. Legislative findings — Purpose.
8	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
9	(1) Entrepreneurs and workers must pay various fees in order to
10	work in a government-regulated profession or occupation or to start a small
11	business in Arkansas;
12	(2) Families trying to break the cycle of government dependency
13	should not have to pay the state to earn a living; and
14	(3) Arkansas should waive initial fees associated with
15	occupational and professional regulations and the formation of a business for
16	low-income individuals.
17	(b) It is the purpose of this chapter to increase access to
18	professional and occupational licenses that would otherwise be cost
19	prohibitive for certain individuals.
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21	17-4-103. Definitions.
22	As used in this chapter:
23	(1) "License" means a license, certificate, registration,
24	permit, or other form of authorization required by law or rule that is
25	required for an individual to engage in a particular occupation or
26	<pre>profession;</pre>
27	(2) "Licensing entity" means an office, board, commission,
28	department, council, bureau, or other agency of state government having
29	authority to license, certify, register, permit, or otherwise authorize an
30	individual to engage in a particular occupation or profession.
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32	17-4-104. Fee waiver.
33	Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a licensing entity shall not
34	require an initial fee for individuals who are seeking to receive a license
35	in this state if the applicant has a household income that does not exceed
36	two hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty income guidelines.

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2	17-4-105. Licensing entity duties.
3	A licensing entity shall:
4	(1) Publish notice of the fee waiver on:
5	(A) The website maintained by the licensing entity; and
6	(B) Any relevant forms that an applicant is required to
7	complete; and
8	(2) Promulgate any necessary rules to implement this chapter.
