23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

25 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - GRANTS AND AID TO LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND
26 SPECIAL PROGRAMS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of
27 Education, to be payable from the Division of Elementary and Secondary
28 Education Public School Fund Account, for grants and aid to local school
29 districts and special programs of the Department of Education - Division of
30 Elementary and Secondary Education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022,

23 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. R.I.S.E.

25 ARKANSAS - CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for

26 R.I.S.E. Arkansas remaining on June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022, in the Division of

27 Elementary and Secondary Education Public School Fund Account shall be

28 designated and retained for the R.I.S.E. Arkansas. Any carry forward of

29 unexpected balance of funding as authorized herein, may be carried forward

30 under the following conditions:

31 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022 the Agency shall by written statement

32 set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the

33 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

34 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall

35 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee all

36 amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or

1 Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the
2 Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding
3 carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that
4 appropriation and a copy of the written request set forth in item (1) above;

5 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a
6 written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
7 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written
8 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose, etc.
9 for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty
10 (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution
11 presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget
12 Committee; and

13 (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall
14 include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals
15 and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or
16 Institution.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
18 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

19

20 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
22 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in the
23 Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and Special Programs section of this
24 Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated Funding
25 that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for Special
26 Needs Isolated Funding in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and
27 Special Programs section of this Act and shall be used there for fully
28 funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code § 6-20-604 on a pro
29 rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro rata basis is defined
30 as providing each district qualifying for additional funding under
31 subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how each
32 district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional funding
33 amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and appropriation
34 remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code § 6-
35 20-604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the provisions of Arkansas
36 Code § 6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the available funds are

1 exhausted.

2 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
3 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

4

5 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO
7 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School
8 Districts appropriation in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and
9 Special Programs section of this Act, "school district" means a school
10 district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state for the
11 education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district because
12 the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is completely
13 separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir covering
14 at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend school in
15 their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to travel or
16 to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or road route)
17 of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school district or
18 districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the monies
19 appropriated for Grants to School Districts in the Grants and Aid to Local
20 School Districts and Special Programs section of this Act to such school
21 districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating the pupils
22 residing in the separated portion of the school district. The payments are to
23 be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such school districts
24 shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department of Education and
25 provide the Department of Education with such documentation as is deemed
26 necessary.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
28 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

29

30 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
32 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special
33 Education Services" in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and
34 Special Programs section of this Act shall be used to provide extended year
35 summer programs for handicapped students in need of such services, to provide
36 special education services to foster children who are wards of the State, and

1 to provide funds for the payment of salaries of special education
2 supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute such funds in the
3 manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
5 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

6
7 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

9 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
10 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
11 established by the State Board of Education.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
13 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

14
15 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

17 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
18 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
19 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
21 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

22
23 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER

25 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval
26 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas
27 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to
28 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related
29 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however,
30 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than
31 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

32 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
33 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
34 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
35 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
36 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by

1 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
2 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently
3 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of
4 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision
5 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General
6 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
7 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The
8 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
9 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by
10 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional
11 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
13 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

14

15 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN
17 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds
18 authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each
19 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each
20 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -
21 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the
22 Quiz Bowl.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
24 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

25

26 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
28 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School
29 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any
30 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the
31 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for
32 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the
33 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas,
34 Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the
35 Department of Correction.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~

1 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

2

3 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER
5 CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby
6 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for
7 administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds
8 shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to
9 ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of
10 the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek
11 prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget
12 Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the
13 Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds
14 that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of
15 Elementary and Secondary Education to administer the program.

16 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
17 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
18 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
19 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
20 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
21 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary
22 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring
23 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as
24 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative
25 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section.
26 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
27 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
28 this entire section is void.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
30 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

31

32 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AVERAGE
34 TEACHER SALARY. The Arkansas Department of Education is requested to
35 calculate Average Teacher Salary in the Department's Annual Statistical
36 Report to not include extra duty funds. Specifically, the Department is

27 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
28 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
