24	SECTION 1. Arkansas	Code § 15-4-209(a), conce	rning the functions,
25	powers, and duties of the A	rkansas Economic Developm	ent Commission, is
26	amended to add an additiona	l subdivision to read as	follows:
27	<u>(21)</u> Promote a	and support military instal	<u>llations for state and</u>

30	SECTION 2. Arkansas C	Code Title 15, Chapter 4, :	is amended to add an
31	additional subchapter to re	ad as follows:	
32	<u>Subchapter 39</u> -	— Arkansas Military Affair	<u>'s Council Act</u>

34	<u>15-4-3901. Title.</u>		
35	<u>This subchapter shall</u>	be known and may be cited	d as the "Arkansas
36	<u>Military Affairs Council Ac</u>	<u>:t".</u>	



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2	15-4-3902. Legislative intent.
3	The General Assembly finds that:
4	(1) The State of Arkansas has a long and distinguished history
5	of hosting military installations vital to the defense of the United States;
6	(2) This state is currently home to the following five (5)
7	military installations:
8	(A) Little Rock Air Force Base in Jacksonville, Arkansas;
9	(B) Pine Bluff Arsenal in White Hall, Arkansas;
10	(C) Camp Joseph T. Robinson in North Little Rock,
11	<u>Arkansas;</u>
12	(D) Ebbing Air National Guard Base in Fort Smith,
13	Arkansas; and
14	(E) Fort Chaffee Joint Maneuver Training Center in Fort
15	<u>Chaffee</u> , Arkansas;
16	(3) Military installations are a major employer and contribute
17	to state and local economic development;
18	(4) The closure or reduction in operation of any military
19	installation would have a detrimental impact on the economy of our state; and
20	(5) State and local support for a military installation is a
21	significant consideration of the United States Government in making decisions
22	<u>to realign or close a military installation.</u>
23	
24	<u>15-4-3903. Definitions.</u>
25	<u>As used in this subchapter:</u>
26	(1) "City" means a city of the first class, a city of the second
27	class, or an incorporated town in this state;
28	(2) "Economic development organization" means a business entity:
29	(A) In good standing with the Secretary of State; and
30	(B) Formed to promote community development and economic
31	development in a geographic area within this state;
32	(3) "Eligible applicant" means:
33	<u>(A) A city;</u>
34	(B) A county;
35	(C) An economic development organization;
36	(D) A military community council;

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1	(E) A military installation; or
2	(F) A state agency;
3	(4) "Military community council" means a business entity:
4	(A) In good standing with the Secretary of State; and
5	(B) Formed to promote cooperation between military and
6	civilian components of a designated geographic area within this state through
7	the adoption and implementation of matters of joint interest to a military
8	installation and the surrounding community by establishing and maintaining:
9	(i) Necessary infrastructure;
10	(ii) Safe and secure communities; and
11	(iii) Support services; and
12	(5)(A) "Military installation" means a facility located in this
13	state that is under the jurisdiction of the United States Department of
14	Defense or the Department of the Military, including without limitation a:
15	<u>(i) Base;</u>
16	<u>(ii) Camp;</u>
17	<u>(iii) Post;</u>
18	(iv) Station;
19	<u>(v) Yard;</u>
20	(vi) Center; or
21	(vii) Homeport facility for any ship.
22	(B) "Military installation" does not include a facility
23	used primarily for:
24	(i) National guard armories;
25	(ii) Civil works;
26	(iii) Rivers and harbors projects; or
27	(iv) Flood control projects.
28	
29	<u> 15-4-3904. Arkansas Military Affairs Council — Creation — Members.</u>
30	(a) There is established the Arkansas Military Affairs Council.
31	(b) The purpose of the council is to advise and assist the Director of
32	the Arkansas Economic Development Commission in the performance of his or her
33	duties under this subchapter.
34	(c)(1) The Arkansas Military Affairs Council shall consist of twelve
35	(12) members appointed at the discretion of the Governor.
36	(2) Members of the council shall consist of:

1	(A) Residents of communities near a military installation,
2	including without limitation the following military installations:
3	(i) Little Rock Air Force Base in Jacksonville,
4	Arkansas;
5	(ii) Pine Bluff Arsenal in White Hall, Arkansas;
6	(iii) Camp Joseph T. Robinson in North Little Rock,
7	<u>Arkansas;</u>
8	(iv) Fort Chaffee Joint Maneuver Training Center in
9	Fort Chaffee, Arkansas; and
10	(v) Ebbing Air National Guard Base in Fort Smith,
11	Arkansas; and
12	(B) Representatives of aerospace and defense companies
13	located within the State of Arkansas.
14	(3) Members of the council shall serve for five-year terms.
15	(d) The council shall select by majority vote:
16	(1) One (1) member of the council to serve as chair; and
17	(2) One (1) member of the council to serve as vice chair.
18	(e)(1) Members of the council shall serve without compensation.
19	(2) However, if funds are appropriated for expense
20	reimbursement, the members of the council may receive expense reimbursement
21	in accordance with § 25-16-902.
22	
23	<u>15-4-3905. Military Affairs Division — Military Affairs Director —</u>
24	Creation.
25	(a) There is created the Military Affairs Division within the Arkansas
26	Economic Development Commission to be the instrumentality of this state to
27	promote and support military installations in the State of Arkansas.
28	(b)(l) There is created the Military Affairs Director to head the
29	Military Affairs Division.
30	(2) The Director of the Arkansas Economic Development Commission
31	shall hire a qualified applicant to serve as the Military Affairs Director.
32	(c) All state agencies shall provide the Director of the Arkansas
33	Economic Development Commission with assistance in advancing the purpose of
34	the division by ensuring that the activities of the division are coordinated
35	with the activities of other state agencies to achieve the purposes of this
36	subchapter.

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2	15-4-3906. Powers, functions, and duties.
3	The Director of the Arkansas Economic Development Commission, the
4	Military Affairs Director, and the Military Affairs Division, with the advice
5	and assistance of the Arkansas Military Affairs Council, shall have the
6	following powers, functions, and duties:
7	(1) To collect and distribute comprehensive information relating
8	to the mission capability and economic impact of a military installation to:
9	(A) A federal or state agency;
10	(B) A city;
11	(C) A county;
12	(D) A military community council;
13	(E) An economic development organization;
14	(F) An individual; or
15	(G) A corporation;
16	(2) To advise and assist a local government, a military
17	community council, or an economic development organization in:
18	(A) Advocating for the needs of:
19	(i) A military installation;
20	(ii) Military personnel; and
21	(iii) Military families; and
22	(B) Providing timely and effective responses to an inquiry
23	from a federal agency concerning a military installation and its host
24	community;
25	(3) To safeguard state and local economic development interests
26	relating to:
27	(A) A military installation;
28	(B) Military personnel; and
29	(C) Military families;
30	(4) To advise the Governor:
31	(A) Of the steps to take to:
32	(i) Help safeguard and strengthen the mission
33	capability of a military installation; and
34	(ii) Position this state as a priority state in the
35	national defense plan; and
36	(B) On the problems and needs of military families in the

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1	State of Arkansas and to develop appropriate policies at a state level to	
2	mitigate those needs; and	
3	(5) To develop programs and resources to assist military	
4	personnel and their families upon exiting military service so that they may	
5	continue to work and live in this state.	
6		
7	15-4-3907. Military Affairs Grant Program.	
8	The Military Affairs Grant Program is established to provide grants for	
9	projects or programs that:	
10	(1) Support and sustain military installations and military	
11	<u>families in Arkansas; or</u>	
12	(2) Result in economic growth to:	
13	(A) The community hosting a military installation;	
14	(B) The region surrounding a military installation; and	
15	(C) This state.	
16		
17	15-4-3908. Grant application process, review, and approval.	
18	(a)(l) An eligible applicant may submit an application to receive a	
19	grant provided under the Military Affairs Grant Program to the Arkansas	
20	Economic Development Commission.	
21	(2) The commission shall:	
22	(A) Solicit grant applications as funding becomes	
23	available; and	
24	(B) Assign the Governor's Military Affairs Steering	
25	Committee to assist the Military Affairs Director in evaluating grant	
26	applications.	
27	(3) The Director of the Arkansas Economic Development Commission	
28	shall award a grant for a project or program submitted based on the:	
29	(A) Criteria established in the Military Affairs Grant	
30	Program Funding Recommendation Worksheet created by the Military Affairs	
31	Division; and	
32	(B) Grant recommendations of the Military Affairs Director	
33	and the committee.	
34	(b) An eligible applicant applying for a grant under this section	
35	shall submit an application on a form prescribed by the commission that	
36	includes without limitation:	

1	(1) The title of the project or program;
2	(2) The eligible applicant's contact information;
3	(3) The organizational information of the eligible applicant;
4	(4) The sources of all funds that will be used for the project
5	or program, including prior Military Affairs Grant Program awards;
6	(5) All prior Military Affairs Grant Program awards received by
7	the eligible applicant;
8	(6) The project or program proposal information;
9	(7) The amount of funding requested; and
10	(8) The start and completion dates of the project or program.
11	(c) The Military Affairs Director shall:
12	(1) Conduct a preliminary review of each grant application to
13	confirm that the grant application:
14	(A) Was received on or before the due date specified in
15	the grant application solicitation;
16	(B) Was submitted by an eligible applicant;
17	(C) Meets the objectives of the Military Affairs Grant
18	Program;
19	(D) Identifies clearly defined and measurable outcomes
20	relating to the objectives of the Military Affairs Grant Program;
21	(E) Includes a letter of support from the military
22	installation commander if the project or program is located within the legal
23	boundaries of a military installation; and
24	(F) Is complete, including without limitation all required
25	appendices and attachments; and
26	(2) Forward the grant application to the committee at least
27	fifteen (15) days before to the next scheduled committee meeting if the
28	Military Affairs Director determines the grant application meets the
29	preliminary review requirements under subdivision (c)(l) of this section.
30	(d) The committee shall:
31	(1) Review each grant application in accordance with the
32	Military Affairs Grant Program Funding Recommendation Worksheet; and
33	(2) Return to the Military Affairs Director:
34	(A) A completed Military Affairs Grant Program Funding
35	Recommendation Worksheet; and
36	(B) Funding recommendations for each grant application.

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1	(e) The Military Affairs Director shall conduct a final review of each
2	grant application and forward each grant application to the Director of the
3	Arkansas Economic Development Commission for approval.
4	
5	15-4-3909. Grant agreement.
6	An eligible applicant that receives approval from the Director of the
7	Arkansas Economic Development Commission provided under the Military Affairs
8	Grant Program shall execute a grant agreement with the Arkansas Economic
9	Development Commission that includes without limitation the:
10	(1) Eligibility date for incurring costs for the project or
11	program;
12	(2) Projected completion date of the portion of the project or
13	program funded by the grant provided under the Military Affairs Grant
14	Program;
15	(3) Amount of approved costs; and
16	(4) The process by which grant funds shall be disbursed to the
17	eligible applicant.
18	
19	<u>15-4-3910. Rules.</u>
20	The Military Affairs Division shall adopt rules to implement and
21	administer this subchapter, including without limitation rules regarding the:
22	(1) Application process for grants provided under the Military
23	Affairs Grant Program;
24	(2) Disbursement of grant funds; and
25	(3) Reporting required by an eligible applicant that receives
26	grant funds.
27	
28	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
29	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the optimal time to implement
30	this act is at the beginning of the state's fiscal year; and that in order to
31	carry out the requirements of this act for the next fiscal year it is
32	necessary that this act become effective on July 1, 2021 for budgeting
33	purposes. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
34	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
35	become effective on July 1, 2021.
36
