UAMS -9 CENTER FOR DENTAL EDUCATION. There is hereby established a new center in 10 Arkansas for Dental Education in cooperation with the University of Tennessee 11 Dental School, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and Arkansas 12 Children's Hospital. The contracts will 29 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount 30 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for 31 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if 32 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve 33 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars 34 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of 35 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and 36 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of

2 Pediatrics.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020

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6 SECTION 56. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHS AND 8 UAMS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The University of Arkansas for Medical 9 Sciences (UAMS) and the Department of Human Services shall enter into a 10 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to determine any reimbursement, 11 administrative charges or fees for the State Olmstead plan or for processing 12 or administration of State match funds charges as reimbursement funding for 13 federal financial participation under the Medicaid's Disproportionate Share 14 (DSH) reimbursement program or any other arrangements or agreements that 15 could benefit UAMS for Fiscal Year 2019 and forward upon prior review of the 16 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint 17 Budget Committee.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2020}{2021}$ through June 30, $\frac{2021}{2022}$.

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SECTION 57. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 21 22 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 23 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 24 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 25 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 26 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 27 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 28 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 29 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 30 with in disbursement of said funds.

32 SECTION 58. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 33 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 34 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 35 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 36 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

5	SECTION 59. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
6	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits	
7	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the	
8	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of	
9	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in	
10	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the	
11	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm	
12	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental	
13	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act	
14	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health	
15	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.	
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
