## Subtitle

14 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR  
15 MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR THE  
16 2021-2022 FISCAL YEAR.

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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established

32 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for

33 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2021-2022 fiscal

34 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be

35 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such

36 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,

1 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform  
 2 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the  
 3 appropriate classification.

4  
 5 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
 7 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized for the  
 8 University of Arkansas For Medical Sciences, the following number of part-  
 9 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from  
 10 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a  
 11 Nursing PRN Pool; for hundred ten (410), when needed, at rated of pay not to  
 12 exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act. If  
 13 the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as  
 14 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)  
 15 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget  
 16 request.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
 18 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

19  
 20 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
 22 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas  
 23 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary  
 24 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds  
 25 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualifies individuals in a  
 26 UAMS Temporary Pool: five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay  
 27 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this  
 28 Act.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
 30 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

31  
 32 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,  
 33 to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, to be payable from the  
 34 University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund, for personal services and

31 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

33 TRANSFER NCI DESIGNATION TRUST FUND. (i) From time to time at the request of

 13 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical

20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL  
21 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging  
22 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of  
23 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support  
24 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor  
25 is authorized for the ~~2020-2021~~ 2021-2022 fiscal year a pool of seven hundred  
26 (700) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These positions are  
27 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event  
28 that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated clinical or  
29 research programs that are initiated during the ~~2020-2021~~ 2021-2022 fiscal  
30 year require additional positions, either in title, in classification, or in  
31 number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the General Assembly in  
32 the Regular Salaries - Operations section of this Act.

33 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to  
34 access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in  
35 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the  
36 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the

1 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional  
2 positions exists. Only medical or research positions shall be established  
3 under this provision. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for  
4 Medical Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification  
5 of allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool"  
6 to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the ~~Department~~ Arkansas Division  
7 of Higher Education, and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget  
8 Committee for review. The report shall also include an accounting of the  
9 names, titles and salaries of personnel who have been employed in positions  
10 established from this pool and the source and duration of funds associated  
11 with the positions.

12 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests  
13 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as  
14 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be  
15 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

16 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency  
17 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by  
18 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the  
19 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has  
20 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be  
21 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.  
22 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in  
23 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the  
24 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and  
25 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization  
26 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint  
27 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the  
28 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is  
29 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the  
30 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a  
31 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
33 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

35 SECTION 54. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ON-CALL

1 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized  
2 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires  
3 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff  
4 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day  
5 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform  
6 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the  
7 appropriate compensation.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
9 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

10  
11 SECTION 55. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED  
13 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event  
14 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas  
15 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric  
16 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount  
17 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven  
18 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as  
19 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year  
20 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to  
21 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents  
22 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical  
23 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide  
24 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of  
25 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the  
26 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,  
27 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts  
28 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will  
29 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount  
30 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for  
31 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if  
32 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve  
33 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars  
34 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of  
35 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and  
36 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of

1 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of  
 2 Pediatrics.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
 4 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

6 SECTION 56. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHS AND  
 8 UAMS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The University of Arkansas for Medical  
 9 Sciences (UAMS) and the Department of Human Services shall enter into a  
 10 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to determine any reimbursement,  
 11 administrative charges or fees for the State Olmstead plan or for processing  
 12 or administration of State match funds charges as reimbursement funding for  
 13 federal financial participation under the Medicaid’s Disproportionate Share  
 14 (DSH) reimbursement program or any other arrangements or agreements that  
 15 could benefit UAMS for Fiscal Year 2019 and forward upon prior review of the  
 16 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint  
 17 Budget Committee.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
 19 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

21 SECTION 57. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
 22 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
 23 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
 24 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
 25 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
 26 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures  
 27 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
 28 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of  
 29 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
 30 with in disbursement of said funds.

31

32 SECTION 58. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
 33 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
 34 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
 35 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
 36 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

1 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
2 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
3 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.  
4

5 SECTION 59. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
6 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
7 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
8 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of  
9 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
10 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
11 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm  
12 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
13 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
14 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
15 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
