1 Higher Education shall establish and maintain for the 2020-2021 2021-2022 2 fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level not to exceed \$307,741. A position established under this section shall 3 4 not exceed the salary rate of the highest maximum annual salary rate 5 authorized by the General Assembly in the institution's appropriation act. 6 These positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical 7 Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of the University 8 during the 2020-2021 2021-2022 fiscal year exceed the number of positions 9 allocated to the University by the Legislature. 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5	SECTION 59. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

9	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
