32 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for
 33 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2021-2022 fiscal
 34 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be
 35 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such
 36 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,

1 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform
2 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the
3 appropriate classification.

4
5 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
7 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized for the
8 University of Arkansas For Medical Sciences, the following number of part-
9 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from
10 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a
11 Nursing PRN Pool; for hundred ten (410), when needed, at rated of pay not to
12 exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act. If
13 the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as
14 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)
15 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget
16 request.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
18 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

20 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
22 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas
23 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary
24 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds
25 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualifies individuals in a
26 UAMS Temporary Pool: five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay
27 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this
28 Act.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
30 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

SECTION 47. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences may designate up to forty-five percent (45%) of the regular gross salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-404(b)(9).

27 (700) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These positions are
28 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event
29 that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated clinical or
30 research programs that are initiated during the ~~2020-2021~~ 2021-2022 fiscal
31 year require additional positions, either in title, in classification, or in
32 number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the General Assembly in
33 the Regular Salaries - Operations section of this Act.

34 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to

11 established from this pool and the source and duration of funds associated
12 with the positions.

13 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests
14 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as
15 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
16 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

17 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency
18 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
19 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the
20 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has
21 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
22 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
23 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in
24 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the
25 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and
26 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization
27 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint
28 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the
29 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is
30 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the
31 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a
32 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
34 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

36 SECTION 54. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ON-CALL
2 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized
3 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires
4 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff
5 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day
6 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform
7 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the
8 appropriate compensation.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
10 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

11
12 SECTION 55. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED
14 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event
15 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas
16 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric
17 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount
18 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven
19 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as
20 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year
21 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to
22 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents
23 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical
24 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide
25 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of
26 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the
27 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,
28 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts
29 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will
30 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount
31 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for
32 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if
33 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve
34 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars
35 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of
36 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and

1 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
2 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
3 Pediatrics.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
5 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

6
7 SECTION 56. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHS AND
9 UAMS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The University of Arkansas for Medical
10 Sciences (UAMS) and the Department of Human Services shall enter into a
11 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to determine any reimbursement,
12 administrative charges or fees for the State Olmstead plan or for processing
13 or administration of State match funds charges as reimbursement funding for
14 federal financial participation under the Medicaid's Disproportionate Share
15 (DSH) reimbursement program or any other arrangements or agreements that
16 could benefit UAMS for Fiscal Year 2019 and forward upon prior review of the
17 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint
18 Budget Committee.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~
20 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

21
22 SECTION 57. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
23 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
24 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
25 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
27 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
28 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
29 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
30 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
31 with in disbursement of said funds.

32
33 SECTION 58. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
34 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
35 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
36 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

1 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
2 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
3 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
4 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
5

6 SECTION 59. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
7 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
8 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
9 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of
10 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
11 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
12 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm
13 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
14 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
15 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
16 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
